

Jesus & The Eucharist: A Personal Response

The gospel for this weekend gives us a fresh lens to view our response to the ongoing call toward Eucharistic revival in the church, particularly here in the U.S.

What I want to emphasize in the gospel story is not the drama that unfolded around the payment of wages but the understanding of its spiritual significance.

The first thing we notice in the story is that it is about a vineyard. Vineyards in the scriptures signify a special possession. Isaiah hinted at this when he referenced Israel in the Old Testament as the vineyard of the Lord (Cf. Isaiah 5:1-7).

In the era of the New Testament, it is Jesus who calls himself the vine, and his followers as the branches of the vine; his father is the vine grower (Cf. John 15:4-6).

So what is the big takeaway from the story? You see, here is the thing. The church is what is being referred to as the vineyard. God's church, which he has established at the lofty price of the Son's blood, is in our midst. And we are called not only to be part of it but also to be welcoming to all those who join us.

We should also understand that people are called to the church at different times and under distinct circumstances. We must always welcome them, appreciate their arrival in the church, and celebrate with them. Recall another teaching of Jesus in John 6:44: "No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws them, and I will raise them at the last day."

Equal rewards or pay in the church is nothing but the big B and B. This Body and Blood of Jesus is not simply a reward for participating in the celebration of the liturgy but a thankful gift of love we receive from God who freely calls us to be part of his Church. All this comes to one revealing truth: The Eucharist is not a gift to miss or to fail to receive. It is also not a meritorious gift but a gratuitous one to be received with a thankful heart.

When we enter the church to receive Christ in Holy Communion or Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, we are rewarded with many graces, both spiritual and temporal. The devoted practice of Eucharistic adoration can thus nurture and enrich the spiritual lives of the members and the overall parish community.

The good news is that Jesus and the Eucharist in the Church make us God's particular possessions. So take a fresh look at the place of Jesus and the Eucharist in your life and make the personal response needed towards an enthusiastic revival and regular participation in Mass to receive the B&B.



With the beginning of our Faith Formation year, you will notice a new weekly *Proclamation* in the bulletin. This will be a phrase or key point of the weekly Scripture readings. The *Proclamation* will be discussed in all FF classes and will be used in their materials and activities. Additionally, there will be a question posted each week related to the *Proclamation*. This could be a great discussion starter on the way home or around the dinner table.
