

Pastor Speaks Go with "the first"

This weekend's gospel from Matthew continues with Jesus' deployment of parables as a pedagogical technique and style to communicate the truth about the kingdom of God. As a matter of understanding, these kingdom parables are imbued with both mundane and ordinary and spiritual lessons. Therefore, this parable about a father and his two sons offers us some practical lessons for life and deeper insights into our spiritual affairs.

The first reading from the prophet Ezekiel coincides with the gospel about the theme of a person's present state of life. The question it provokes is, which is better, who I am now or who I used to be? The prophet Ezekiel 18:25-28 paves the way for understating that God cares more about the present situation of a person than the past. Thus, we heard that in regard to sin and condemnation, "When someone virtuous turns away from virtue to commit iniquity and dies, it is because of the iniquity he committed that he must die" (18:26). However, those who make amendments and "turn from the wickedness they did and do what is right and just, they save their lives; since they turned away from all the sins they committed, they shall live; they shall not die" (18:27-28).

Similarly, Jesus' parable cites the first son who initially resisted his father's will and requested to have him labor in his vineyard as the one who eventually followed and fostered an unbreakable family bond. On the contrary, the second son, whose words initially appeared appealing to the father, reneged on his words and disappointed the father. Therefore, as we have said yes to God through baptism, let's continue to follow it.

The application of the readings to our daily experiences can occur in the area of family relationships and interactions. There are things that foster family bonds and well-being; it is up to all members to recognize and apply themselves to the responsibilities placed on them to build and maintain an enduring, safe, and respectful home. Loving and honoring your family to the end is what issues forth a meaningful and happy life.

The spiritual meaning of the readings highlights personal growth and change as integral to human experiences in the physical and spiritual domains. We grow better by learning to undertake the right actions and amend our negative tendencies, experiences, and relationships.

Indeed, growth and change can be painful because they often restrict and limit us. But we learn from the readings that God's desire is to see us transform and lean forward toward obedience and love for Him, which is something that needs to occur daily.

Again, Jesus' use of work in the vineyard is a metaphor for God's special possession and for the Eucharist. The father's request to both sons to be in the vineyard symbolizes truly the invitation to all people to receive the "Blood" of Christ to be poured out for many. And while one refused it, the other accepted it when he recognized its value.

Sometimes, we wonder about the truth about Jesus in the Eucharist and it affects the way we respond to the invitation and how we prepare to receive it. But, like the first son, if you doubt it then pray that one day you will perceive this reality and intensely turn to it.



With the beginning of our Faith Formation year, you will notice a new weekly *Proclamation* in the bulletin. This will be a phrase or key point of the weekly scripture readings. The *Proclamation* will be discussed in all FF classes and will be used in their materials and activities. Additionally, there will be a question posted each week related to the *Proclamation*. This could be a great discussion starter on the way home or around the dinner table.
