

Celebrating All Saints and All Souls

The feasts of All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day will take place this week. To that end, we urge all parishioners to attend church and join in the celebrations that commemorate the saints and the faithful departed.

All Saints Masses are as follows:

- 1. Vigil Mass, Tuesday, 6:30 pm, at St. Isidore
- 2. Morning Mass, Wednesday, 8 am, at Sacred Heart
- 3. Wednesday, 6:30 pm, at St. John

We celebrate the Feast of All Saints' Day or All Hallows, in honor of all the saints, both known and unknown. The feast is observed on November 1st by Western churches and the first Sunday after Pentecost by Eastern churches.

We dedicate this day to remembering saints and martyrs of our Christian tradition who have attained the beatific vision in Heaven, which essentially refers to direct communication with God in the afterlife.

Historically, the feast originated from Christian pilgrims who visited holy shrines and catacombs of saints, and from there developed into a Church-wide celebration. For the Catholic Church, it is considered a Holy Day of Obligation – a day when the faithful are expected to attend Mass. Other Christian denominations also acknowledge this day by organizing special church services or liturgies.

Next is All Souls' Day. All Souls' Day Mass is at St. Isidore, on *Thursday, November 2, at 8 am.* Also, there will be an All Souls' Memorial Mass at St. Isidore on Sunday, November 4, at 2 pm.

All Souls' Day is when we remember and pray for the souls of people who may be in Purgatory. Purgatory, as we believe, is a place or state of suffering inhabited by the souls of sinners who are expiating their sins before going to heaven.

While All Saints' Day honors the saints residing in Heaven, All Souls' Day is dedicated to those who are achieving salvation. All Souls' Day involves prayers for the deceased, Masses, visiting grave sites of loved ones, and lighting candles, It is seen as a day of remembrance, reflection, and honor for all those who have led exemplary lives of faith.


