

# Pastor Speaks "Behold, I Am Making All Things New"

Dear Parishioners,

As we enter the third Sunday of our Advent season, we are just a week away from celebrating the birth of Christ. So, let me express my warmest greetings of Happy Advent and Merry Christmas. It is becoming exciting as we ready ourselves to celebrate the remarkable Christmas feast and reawaken in one another the love of God that we share.

In addition, remember that piercing through time and space and standing before us now are the love, faith, and trust of the family at the center of the Advent and Christmas seasons—the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. So, may the love of Christ, the unquestionable faith of the blessed Mother Mary, and the trusting spirit of Joseph encourage us to embrace the new things God is seeking to accomplish in our lives.
