Pastor Speaks

Easter Sunday of Hope

Dear Parishioners,

The Lord is risen, Alleluia!

Christians all over the world rejoice because our Lord is risen. This is a joyful moment. The death and resurrection of Christ is not only historic but also a mystery. Mystery events and celebrations go beyond time and space. They maintain their originality. Thus, over two thousand years of Christ's death does not make it irrelevant to our time as some believe; its freshness is present to us this year as the past and will be forever.

So, we celebrate Easter. And this reminds us that our faith is not in vain. It is a feast of Jesus' victory over sin and death. Easter is a statement that death is not the end of the story. There is one more chapter, this is the most important chapter. And in the last chapter of the story of Jesus we see him rise from the dead in all glory and majesty. He is vindicated. Jesus regains his eternal glory with the Father.

The Church asks us to rejoice and be glad. Easter does not only bring our attention to or recall the resurrection of Jesus and its impacts on the first disciples but also brings meaning to our life of faith. Easter does not only strengthen our faith in the resurrection but also empowers us to proclaim our faith and bear witness to the risen Lord.

As we celebrate the rising of the Lord from death, we must ask ourselves whether we have truly risen with him this Easter. Today's gospel tells us that Jesus left the linen clothes in the grave, in other words, he did not cling to any worldly possession nor allow them to pull him down. If we must truly rise with Christ, we must equally be ready to detach ourselves from all unnecessary possessions that pull us down spiritually.

Through our Lenten observance, we died with Christ, so let us rise with him through the power of the Holy Spirit. Let us seek the things of light, things that glorify God. We must be preoccupied with heavenly things by living like citizens of Heaven.

During this Easter, let us be convinced that despite all the suffering that we may encounter in our lives we will be given the crown of glory and share in the glory of our Lord. Let us remember that we are Easter people and Alleluia is our song.

Let us be channels of the Risen Jesus, bringing the peace of His resurrection to those with whom we live and work and worship with and to the world. Happy Easter!


