# **Pastor Speaks**

# **Sunday of Great Mercy**

Dear Parishioner,

What do you need the most of right now? And of what does the world need the most? Isn't it the Mercy of God? We all need God's Mercy and so does the world. Consider what Saint Paul said in Roman 8:18-20, "I consider that our present sufferings are not comparable to the glory that will be revealed in us. The creation waits in eager expectation for the revelation of the sons of God. For the creation was subjected to futility, not by its own will, but because of the One who subjected it, in hope." What Paul's strong assertion here is that God's Mercy is needed by all and not limited in its reach to all who are part of God's creation.

Ever since the fall of Adam and Eve, the world has subjected pain and suffering which has been passed on to all of humanity. We live in a broken world. But we don't have to keep a broken soul. And the solution is receiving God's Mercy to heal and mend our broken soul.

The Sunday of Divine Mercy therefore offers us hope. The Second Sunday of Easter is designated as Divine Mercy Sunday. It is a feast based on our Catholic belief in God's Mercy, and which leads us to engage in the various devotions related to the Divine Mercy.

The history of Divine Mercy is well known to many of us, originating from the instructions Jesus passed on to Saint Sister Faustina; Saint John Paul II instituted it as a feast to be combined with the Second Sunday of Easter. The pope at the time realized how critical it is for the Church to re-emphasize the tremendous gift of God's mercy to us.

Through Saint Sister Faustina's diary, the world has learned so much about Divine Mercy devotions focusing on Jesus' passion. Here are some familiar devotional practices:

1. The 3 o'clock hour: Pause to think about the passion of Christ and say the simple Divine Mercy prayers as part of the chaplet:

"Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world."

"For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world."

2. Praying the Divine Mercy Chaplet: Pick any Divine Mercy Chaplet and learn how to pray for it and do it daily or regularly.

With the passing of Pope Francis, (Preacher of Mercy) on Monday after Easter Sunday, it has caused me to reflect on the death of John Paul (Apostle of Divine Mercy) 20 years ago this April, occurring on the Eve of Divine Mercy. I cannot but feel encouraged to trust in God's Mercy and pray for it to come to all of us.

"O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fount of mercy for us, I trust in You!"
