1. Disciple Maker Index Survey Results

A couple of weeks ago, Sonia, the Pastoral Council Chairperson, informed us that the analysis and outcomes of the Disciple Maker Index Survey we responded to for the archdiocese were ready. She went on to briefly share with us some high-level indicators of the strengths and opportunities of the parish.

At that time, two significant points were mentioned, namely, our strong belief in the real presence of Jesus in the Sacrament of the Eucharist and our conviction that the scriptures are truly the Word of God. These convictions, by every means, are positive reflections on our parish as an authentic Catholic parish knowing that our Catholic faith is grounded in these two realities.


The Pastoral Council is still reflecting on the results. However, at this time, the archdiocese has determined that more elements of the results and analyses be shared with parishioners so we can together reflect further on them and take an improvement approach to them.

2. National Eucharistic Pilgrimage Events in Dubuque

Did you know already that the Archdiocese of Dubuque is hosting one of the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage "legs" or paths that is making its way from Indianapolis to Los Angeles from mid-May to the Feast of Corpus Christi? That is certainly exciting! According to the available information, eight Perpetual Pilgrims, made up of four young men and four young women, are accompanying the Blessed Sacrament, which will make its way to the archdiocese from the Davenport Diocese from May 23-27, 2025.

The five-day stay of the pilgrims, with the Blessed Sacrament used the National Eucharistic Congress, will be marked with some events, including processions and prayers at various locations. It will be followed by different processions and will end in the Saint Raphael Cathedral for prayer service.
