Pastor Speaks

The Most Holy Trinity: The Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity was instituted by Pope John XXII. This celebration in which we consider God's intimate relationship with us as expressed in three persons not only calls on us to reflect on the beauty of God but also to stay in touch with all three persons as one God. As the Father, God created us; as the Son, God saved us, and as the Holy Spirit, God lives in us to express His Love for us. Augustine wrote "You see the Trinity if you see love," explaining that the Father is the lover, the Son is the loved one and the Holy Spirit is the personification of the very act of loving.

Traces of the mystery of the Trinity are communicated through the readings for this celebration. Proverbs 8 relates the Father of creation to the ever-present Son depicted as wisdom, Romans 5 links Jesus as the Son of God with the Holy Spirit with whom we have been sealed for the day of our redemption, and the gospel connects the relationship existing among the three of them. In this light, the Church stresses that "the whole divine economy is the common work of the three divine persons...It is above all the divine mission of the Son's Incarnation and gift of the Holy Spirit that show forth the properties of the divine persons" (CCC 258).

We all remember the ancient story told about St. Augustine as he tried to conceive an explanation for the mystery of the Trinity. As Augustine walked along the beach, he saw a small boy pouring seawater with a shell into a small hole in the sand. "What are you doing, my child?" asked Augustine. "I am trying to empty the sea into this hole in the sand," the boy answered with an innocent smile. "But this is impossible, my dear child," said Augustine. The boy stood up, looked straight into the eyes of Augustine and replied, "what you are trying to do – trying to comprehend the immensity of God with your small head – is even more impossible." So then Augustine saw God as a being to love not to be understood as God is love itself.

Pope Benedict XVI also places love at the center of the Trinity. Pope Benedict notes "we contemplate the Most Holy Trinity as Jesus introduced us to it. He revealed to us that God is love...because the Father is love, the Son is love, the Spirit is love. God is wholly and only love, the purest, infinite and eternal love. He does not live in splendid solitude but rather in an inexhaustible source of life that is ceaselessly given and communicated."

Today's solemnity calls on us to center our worship and prayers on the Holy Trinity. One of the prayers of St. Francis Xavier was: "Most Holy Trinity, who lives in me, I praise You, I worship You, I adore You and love You." Let us make this our prayer as well. May the Son lead us to the Father through the Spirit, to live with the Triune God forever and ever. Amen.

Glory to the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit: to God who is, who was, and who is to come.
