 - Catechesis: Staying in love by knowing more about God (like knowing as much about our wives)


You can't love Someone you don't know; you can't know Someone you don't love



I pray everyone well!

Happy Advent and the beginning of the Liturgical Calendar! Please enjoy this Joyous time with your Families in preparing for the Birth of Jesus! To every Council, please look at your memberships, look at how your Council wants to succeed and what your Council is going to do about it? If the Councils can do this, then Councils will succeed. There are training sessions online every month to help you succeed. Look at this time also to work with the men, who are not Knights and encourage them to become Knights! Encouragement can take many forms. Speaking to the men, showing the good works of the Council through the family events that the Council Sponsors, and the support your Council provide your Priests and Parishes. These are but a few ideas. Show yourselves as Knights regularly, by wearing your polos and having Corporate Communions! (A shout out to our Sir Knights!)

December begins membership renewal. Please help your Financial Secretaries by checking on Brothers that you may have not heard from in a while to ensure they are ok. Help with the Retention Committee's. Do not automatically write off a Brother! Also, begin preparing your Councils Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity. This form is due January 31. Get ahead of it now, and it will be easier to complete.

We are going to begin the second half of the Fraternal year. If your Council leadership has not completed their Safe Environment Training, please take the time to complete. It will not take long and will maintain your Council's compliance! It is a requirement for Star Council!

The following Council Officer positions are required to complete this: Grand Knight, Program Director, Community Director, and Family Director are the required positions. Thank you to all the Councils that are now compliant with Youth Protection Training. All members can complete this training if they choose. The three Dioceses in New Mexico also have requirements to support Youth Protection within their Diocese, please ensure those requirements are complete also. Please complete the Youth Protection Training if you are in any of the required positions!

If your Council has a Columbus Club, please review the Handbook for Councils using Home Corporations. Again, Councils can find this in the Officers Desk Reference of Member Management. There are specifics that must be met to ensure a Home Corporation follows Laws and Rules of the Order. Additionally, following NM State Laws and rules is paramount and could be very costly if not adhered to as the Home Corporation and the Council.

Please ensure you have sent your Forms that are required at this point in the Fraternal Year. The following forms are currently due from your Councils: Form 185- Report of Chosen Officers for the Term, Form 365- Service Program Personnel Report, and Form 1295- Semiannual Council Audit. To save on mailing use your Member Management Software. Some of the forms can be directly submitted online or via email. If you have questions or need help using Member Management software, please ask your District Deputies for assistance.

If you have questions on different issues within your Council, the Officer Desk Reference located in Member Management is a great source of information that Councils can look at first to find solutions. Also, the annual Fraternal Leader Success Planner-https://www.kofc.org/en/resources/membership/fraternal-leader-success-planner5033.pdf

will keep you on time and help you succeed with your Council events.

Brothers and families all.

The first six months of Fraternal Year 2022-23 is behind us and now the plan for each council in the State is finishing up their Fraternal Year.

The state awards are around the corner on March 1, 2023. the Mid-year in Hobbs, NM is on 3 December 2022 and in three weeks a Happy New Years. The councils' activities with the birth of Jesus Christ are one busiest times of the year. Faith activities for all councils can be achieved easily during this time. January is March for Life at the State Capitol of NM, April is faith activities as the Eucharist is the heart of the catholic faith which provides community the glue as a team.

Reports and forms are part of a council to shine in two ways 1) supreme awards 2) Parish Priest with parishioners. It takes help and coordination within a council to do activities in Faith in Action (FIA). I am here to provide assistance in filling these activity forms as well as your District Deputies and former Council Program Directors. For Instance, Council 15788 has two activities in April - Devine Mercy Sunday and Food for Family to complete the Columbian Award for the fraternal year. Membership award of five new members is needed for star council again. It can be done with a GK and/or program director.

I had updated the Service Program Handbook and gave it to State Deputy for review. In the Handbook was the Rubrics for the seven State Awards and FIA Categories of Faith, Family, Community, and Life. The State is asking for the councils to submit their best activity of the following awards: 1) Outstanding Catholic Boy and Girl of the Year Scholarship Award for college bound high school graduates; 2) Culture of Life Pro-Life Person/Couple of the Year Award; 3) Knight of the Year Award; 4) Lady of the Year Award; 5) Family of the Year Award; 6) Service Program Awards in FIA; 7) Council Yearbook of the Year Award; 8) Council Newsletter of the Year Award.

State awards above 2-5 must have Form 10784 submitted to supreme and inserted in the state awards submissions and more. The state awards above for 7 and 8 is done at the Annual Convention in May 2023. Refer to the rubrics on what is needed brothers. I kept all changes from 2020 from my predecessor Brother Anthony Romero.

- 1. NOTE- submit state awards in PDF format first to State Executive Secretary/Awards Chairman by March 1, 2023.
- 2. NOTE winning awards from those councils needs a hard copy sent to the State Program Director in a 3-ring binder for submissions to Supreme.

The recent election results were a disappointment for pro-lifers throughout New Mexico. The antilife abortionists won this round, but we can take some satisfaction that we came close to having a pro-life government in Santa Fe. Another source of good news is the effectiveness of pregnancy resource centers in the state. I've had the opportunity to visit with some of them and was very impressed by the energy, positive attitude and commitment the people, (mostly women - mothers and grandmothers),have at these centers. They are, in a word, tireless.

The main reason I communicate with these resource centers is to learn how we Knights, and our families can be of help. Our ultrasound initiative is, of course, best known as a major factor in saving babies' lives which is why we need to continue funding the State Council's ultrasound account. We should have three or four new machines by the end of 2022, or early 2023 bringing the State's total to twelve. Since it seems we shall continue to be the baby killing capital of the nation, it is critical we approach our pro-life mission with even more confidence and enthusiasm.

By now most of us have heard of Supreme's new program Aid and Support After Pregnancy, (ASAP). This gives your council and parish another way to give immediate hands-on help to pregnancy resource centers in your area. For every \$500 in value, money, baby clothing, diapers, etc. given to a pregnancy center up to \$2,000 Supreme gives them \$100 up to \$400. I urge you to log on to Supreme's web site




STAR COUNCIL



The saying no news is good news was not a true statement for the busy month of October in Clovis, New Mexico. Due to the article cutoff date, I was unable to include more important events that occurred towards the last half of the month.

It continued on Thursday, October 20, 2022, with our Faithful District Deputy Paul Benoit assisting and coordinating with the Pregnancy Resource Center's 14th Annual Fund-raising Banquet. Supporting and attending were approximately 550 people plus Sir Knights, Brother Knights, and their spouses from Assembly 1686 and Council 8304. The Eternal Statistics given were: "We experienced 1,182 total client visits, ministering to 315 new clients. We performed 157 pregnancy tests, of which 111 were positive. We believe over 93% of those 111 pregnant women chose life for their unborn babies. We performed 145 life-affirming ultrasounds."

The best news in October was to read about Group Leaders asking city officials to ban abortion clinics in Clovis and declare the city a "sanctuary city for the unborn." However, a city ordinance is required approval by the city commissioners. "The ordinance as written may be viewed on the internet by going to the link:

http://cloviscitynm.iqm2.com/Citizens/Default.aspx. Unfortunately, at the latest Commissioners meeting the ordinance was tabled."

Regardless of the outcome, we should pray daily for God's gift of life, keep faith in the protection of the unborn, and be the defenders of human dignity.

As the calendar year 2022 comes to an end, I look forward to the coming Advent season of preparation for Christmas and the celebration of the birth of our Lord and Savior, Jesus.

As with past years, our Assembly, Holy Child Assembly #3282 in the East Mountains outside of Albuquerque, placed 230+ US flags on the gravesites of deceased veterans in honor of their patriotism to our blessed country. As evidenced below, US Army Private Francisco Sanchez served our country in World War II and then lived a long, hopefully blessed life until 2015. This should remind us of several things: 1) our freedom is not free and 2) it takes dedication of time and talent to ensure that we uphold the liberties that this country was founded upon.

Why Christmas is sometimes spelled "Xmas"

Here's something that piqued my curiosity, which perhaps might interest you, also. There are people who find the word 'Xmas,' as an abbreviation for Christmas, offensive. So, I did a bit of researching on the origin of this controversial term that I wish to share with you. The word 'Xmas' is not found in church songbooks or even on many greeting cards, and some people associate 'Xmas' with the holiday as a commercial, secular occasion instead of as a particular cultural and religious ritual.

Now, it seems the word 'Xmas' was first used in the mid-1500s. 'X' represents the Greek letter 'chi,' which is the initial letter in the word $X\rho\iota\sigma\tau\delta\varsigma$ (Chrīstós),). But, actually this usage is nearly as old as Christianity itself, and its origins lie in the fact that the first letter in the Greek word for 'Christ' (Chrīstós), which is 'chi,' is represented by a symbol similar to the letter 'X' in the modern Roman alphabet ($X\rho\iota\sigma\tau\delta\varsigma$). Another abbreviation for Christ is 'Xp,' the 'P' here representing the Greek letter "rho," which is the source of our English

letter "R." A stylized version of the Greek chi (X) and rho (P) is \Re , a symbol of Christ called a Christogram. Later on in English it was reduced to just the letter X as in 'Xmas.'

Now, this might lead you to ask, where does the "mas" in Christmas come from? The 'mas' comes from the Old English word (mæsse) for Mass, as in a church service, especially one in the Roman Catholic Church including a celebration of the Eucharist. That word is believed to have been derived from the Church Latin 'missa,' ultimately from the Latin 'mittere' meaning 'to send,' derived from the concluding formula in the Latin Mass, 'Ite, missa est,' meaning 'Go, it is the dismissal.' That is, the Mass is ended.

Hence, this abbreviation 'Xmas'-- contrary to persistent claims -- is not modern, did not stem from an attempt to remove Christ or other religious aspects from Christmas celebrations, nor was it the creation of advertisers looking to shorten the word 'Christmas' in print ads.

None of this means that Christians (and others) are not perhaps justified in feeling annoyed when people take the shortcut of writing 'Xmas' rather



than 'Christmas,' but the abbreviation was not created specifically for the purpose of demeaning Christ, Christians, Christianity, or Christmas -- rather, it's a very old artifact of a very different language.

And now---as goes the saying---"you know the rest of the story!"


