



5 REASONS WHY YOU SHOULD PRAY THE ROSARY

October has many traditions. There's post-season baseball, tailgating at football games, apple picking and, of course, Halloween. But most importantly, there is the Rosary.

As <u>decreed</u> by Pope Leo XIII, October is the Month of the Rosary. For Knights of Columbus, this has a special significance. When a man joins our Order, he receives a Knights of Columbus rosary – at 1.9 million members, that's a lot of rosaries. And praying the rosary is an activity that our members do communally as part of council life.

According to Catholic traditions, St. Dominic was given the rosary by the Blessed Virgin Mary in 1214 in the Monastery of Prouille.

Since then, it has become one of the Catholic Church's powerful tools of prayer. But why pray the Rosary? Here are 5 of them. One for every decade.

1) The Blessed Mother gave us 15 Promises if we prayed the rosary

Alanus de Rupe, a 15th century Dominican preacher, claimed that he was visited by the Blessed Virgin Mary, who gave <u>15 promises</u> to Christians who prayed the rosary, including the Blessed Mother's special protection and greatest graces, the light of God, a powerful armor against Hell, as well as dominance over misfortune.

2) To obtain world peace

"Continue praying the rosary every day in honor of Our Lady of the Rosary, in order to obtain peace for the world and the end of the war, because only She can help you." This is what <u>Our Lady of Fatima said</u> to three children, Lucia dos Santos and her cousins Francisco and Jacinta Marto in June 1917.

The Blessed Mother visited the children in Fatima, Portugal from May 13, 1917 to October 13, 1917 a period that culminated in the Miracle of the Sun, otherwise known as, "The Day the Sun Danced."

3) Time to reflect on the Gospel mysteries

The rosary consists of the Apostle's Creed, the Hail Mary, the Our Father, the Glory Be, along with other prayers. However, in between each decade, we are invited to reflect on the **Mysteries of the Gospel**: Joyful, Sorrowful, Glorious, and Luminous.

In these mysteries, we rediscover, examine, and ponder the stories from the Gospel, and discover the real meaning of those events in the silence of our hearts.

4) Spiritual healing

And speaking of silence, another purpose of praying the rosary is to allow the repetition of the prayers enter into the silence of our hearts, where Christ's spirit dwells.

It is in that silence, we become more connected with the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

Not only that, but Jesus <u>reveals to us</u> that "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind."

But to do so, we must make time for Him. The rosary is the perfect way to make time to connect with God, and for spiritual healing. Take 15 minutes a day to be one with Him.

5) Prayer works!

The power of prayer is unspeakable. The answer to every prayer is a miracle, in and of itself. It is our lifeline to Him, to our souls, and to each other.

But the reason why October is the Month of the Holy Rosary is due to the power of prayer.

In 1571, Pope St. Pius V organized a group of Christian forces, known as the Holy League, in defense of an imminent invasion by the Ottoman Empire. Before a battle with the Ottoman fleet in the Gulf of Patras, in the Ionian Sea, the pope called on all of Europe to pray the rosary for victory. These prayers was answered, with the Holy League defeating the much larger Ottoman forces on October 7 at the battle of Lepanto.

To commemorate the victory, Pius V established the feast day of "Our Lady of Victory" – also known as Our Lady of the Rosary.

Hundreds of years after the battle of Lepanto, Pope Francis is now **calling** all Catholics this month to pray the rosary daily to "protect the Church from the devil, who always seeks to separate us from God and from each other."

So, in solidarity, let us pray to our most gracious advocate, the Blessed Mother, for peace throughout the world, and within our souls. It only takes 15 minutes.





My Brothers all,

New Mexico is currently moving at a snail's pace when it comes to Membership Drives and Exemplifications this month, my brothers we know there is plenty of activity going on around the state, so I ask that as you host these events you designate a couple of men as recruiters to speak to attendees about who we are, what we do and the benefits of becoming a knight.

As of 9/26/23, we stand 27th in the order at 19.00%, year to date we have brought in 87 new emembers and moved 59 new men into our Councils, we still need to bring in 371 men to reach our goal. We started the month in the top ten of the order and I know with a little effort we can get back up there.

The Central Regional is at 22.00% of their membership goal, followed by the Northern Region with 10.22% and Southern Region with 11.54%.

We currently have 154 emembers statewide, 54 in the Central Region, 39 in the Northern Region, and 59 in the Southern Region.

My brothers, as you can see there is still a lot of work to be done.

Congratulations to District Deputies 2 & 11 on meeting your 1st quarter quotas GOOD JOB BROTHERS keep pushing forward.

Brothers and their families,

I've been a member of the Knights for 30 years and I've seen many changes during this time. One of the positive changes is the appointment of Patrick Mason as Supreme Secretary.

Around 40 councils have not yet submitted their form 365 as of 8-29-2023. The New Mexico state council is working to improve each council and help some councils to regain active council members. In this article, I will focus on form 365. It is important to submit this form by June 30 every year, as per the new rule from Supreme. This change is a good move to get council members moving forward immediately.

To get members to take on the roles of chairman and directors in the council, it is important to know your team. The council only needs a program director, a family director, a community director, a membership director, a retention chairman, and an insurance promotion coordinator. If these positions are unknown at Supreme, safe environment training approval may not be given. Members who need safe environment training should see their GK or district deputies.

As someone who has been a program director for 20+ years, I know that directors and chairmen need help. Previous members should be asked to return and new members should be assigned to form 365. Only 6 required positions out of 14 need to be filled. These members should review their duties and new positions. The tools used by their predecessors are an excellent source of training for new members.

A suggestion for councils is to have an experienced member assist the chairmen and directors with inputting their activity online. A copy of it goes to the GK and the submitter. The program director can assign the activity to a FIA category - 4 activities in each of the 4 categories. Once Supreme receives form 365, it is stored in a database, which can be viewed by the SPD.

Form 365 is a crucial part of the council's administration for Star Council. Please contact your council District Deputy for confirmation of form 365. The District Deputy keeps track of your Star Council reporting with the required forms needed. This month is an information-sharing session on the council's administrative duties. Don't stress! Contact your District Deputy first, then me.

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:






STAR COUNCIL



San Francisco's Extraordinary Cathedral



The Cathedral of St. Mary of the Assumption covers two city blocks at the top of a windswept hill not far from San Francisco's urban center, and is a distinctive city landmark. It seats 2,400 people, with standing room for 1,500 more. The first original cathedral was built in 1854 and still stands today (now known as Old Saint Mary's Church). In 1891, a second cathedral was constructed but was destroyed by arson in 1962. The present-day cathedral was commissioned just as Vatican II was convening in Rome. San Francisco's cathedral was

built to honor Mary's unique role in God's plan for human salvation. Her model of discipleship as expressed in Scripture is the unifying theme of the **seven Marian shrines** in St. Mary's Cathedral.

While older churches were built with devotional alcoves and side chapels and altars, St. Mary's **Marian shrines** are set like jewels around the perimeter of the cathedral interior, inviting visitors into public reflection and prayer. The openness of the shrines in the sanctuary reflects the communal spirit of prayer established by Vatican II.

The shrine sculptures were completed and installed, one at a time, between 1981 and 1996, and are anchored to the walls of the niches by custom-designed structural supports that create a "free-floating" effect over simple kneelers (all photos shown here are by Dennis Callahan/Archdiocese of San Francisco).

Our Lady of Guadalupe - Patroness of the Americas

This is the most prominent shrine, and the most visited. Pilgrims from around the globe, especially those with origins in the Americas pray to the "Queen of the New World" and lay flowers at her feet year-round.



Visitation

Mary is seen serving Elizabeth and her husband, Zechariah; Mary herself is with child. "Mary is carrying the King of Kings in her womb, but Jesus has come not to be served, but to serve..."

Flight into Egypt

This scene from Christ's infancy was considered especially appropriate for a new cathedral in the United States, where many have found safe refuge from violence, persecution and poverty in their home countries. "Trusting in God's providence, symbolized here by the angel, Mary and Joseph follow where God leads."





Wedding Feast at Cana

As wedding guests in Cana, Mary motions to Jesus that the wine has run out. Jesus initially declines His mother's entreaty, telling her that His time had not yet come, but is ultimately moved to act by His mother's faith as His disciple.

Crucifixion

This shrine sculpture is a reflection of St. John's theology linking Jesus' death and resurrection with the birth of the Church. The sculptor captures this by portraying the death of Jesus in the context of victory through resurrection. No nails hold the feet of Jesus to the cross, and no crown of thorns appear on His head, a hint that liberation from death has already begun. A soldier is poised on horseback, ready to pierce the side of Jesus, from which blood and water will pour forth, a symbol of the sacramental life of the Church.





Pentecost

After Jesus' ascension to heaven, Mary and the twelve Apostles receive the promised gift of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, thus commissioning them to preach the Gospel to all nations. Built into this sculpture is a glass case to holds the holy oils blessed in the cathedral at the annual chrism Mass.


Assumption

This was the first shrine commissioned for the cathedral. While not recorded in Scripture, the tradition that Mary shares in the victory of her Son in both body and soul is found indirectly in the First Letter to the Corinthians (15: 22-24) and other Scripture passages.

<u>Guidelines for Council Meetings</u>—Section 124 of the Charter, Constitution, and Laws of the Knights of Columbus requires each subordinate council to hold at least two regular meetings each month.

- One is a Council meeting for all members. The purpose of this meeting is to build fraternal spirit, to share information, to strengthen formation in the faith, and to present matters that require the vote of council members.
- The other monthly meeting is an Officers' Planning meeting. The purpose of this meeting is to plan programs, develop budgets, pay approved bills, prepare motions, discuss new ideas, and deal with other necessary matters. Council officers, directors, and chairpersons are required to attend this meeting. This meeting is open to any council members who wish to attend.
