

PATSOR’S NOTE : THIS IS MORALITY, NOT POLITICS. The following is an article that Fr. Jeff wrote for the Grafton, ND newspaper last month. I am using it with his permission.
A person cannot be Christian and be pro-choice. Pro-choice means pro-death. The reality behind a woman’s right to choose is quite simply, a woman’s right to murder her unborn child. The pro-choice mentality does not originate from God. Who is the principle and source of life and love. No, this mindset has its origin in the devil, who, as Jesus said, “was a murder from the beginning, and has nothing to do with the truth, because there is no truth in him” (Jn. 8:44).
Christians are called to put on the mind of Christ (ref. 1Cor. 2:16), and not compromise with the lying spirit of the world. The mind of Christ is pro-life because He is the Way, the Truth and the Life (ref. 6:14), and all things came to be through Him (ref. Jn. 1:3). Jesus Christ is completely contrary to the spirit of the world. A worldly spirit is demonic and, thus, anti-Christ.
Abortion and its precursor, contraception, are rooted in an anti-Christ spirit of selfishness and pride. Contraception is anti-life because it frustrates the divine plan of sexuality by separating the sexual act from the transmission of life. This effectively diminishes a couple’s capacity for love by saying to the other, “I don’t love you enough to be open to creating another human being with you.” Contraception then renders the sexual act to one of self-centered pleasure for one or both of the partners, even if under the guise of love, because they intentionally withhold the full gift of themselves. This sets the groundwork for an eventual abortive disposition since contraception is anti-life at its core. This is why the Catholic Church promotes the practice of Natural Family Planning because it respects the full meaning of God’s plan for our human sexuality.
The devil continues to dangle the fruit from the Tree of Knowledge of Good and Evil and many find it pleasing to the eye and desirable. Unfortunately, multitudes of Christians have eaten it and adopted a contraceptive or abortive disposition. This devilish rebellion against God is seen most keenly in the supporting, politically or financially, those who promote the death of the unborn. The spirit of the anti-Christ, and the blood sacrifice of our children to the devil, has been allowed to prevail in our society for the last 47 years, since Roe vs. Wade. Over 62 million of our children have already been slaughtered on the altar of our sinfulness.
How do we change the culture of death into a culture of life ? Through repentance, prayer and evangelization. The mercy of God is always available, especially to those who have sinned gravely. There is no sin, except the one against the Holy Spirit, that cannot be forgiven. The sin against the Holy Spirit is unrepentance. For all those involved in contraception and abortion, God wants to forgive you ! Repent ! He is merciful and forgiving. Turn to Him and be saved.
My Christian brothers and sisters, we must be courageous in confronting the spirit of the anti-Christ. We must be silent no more because God is truly with us. Live the Faith and be not afraid.

Who can receive Holy Communion? Holy Communion is reserved for those who are unmarried and have received their First Holy Communion. It is also received by those married within the Catholic Church or has their marriage blessed (con-validated) by the Catholic Church. If you are a Catholic who is married outside the Catholic Church or is living together please refrain from receiving Holy Communion. Those who are married outside the Church please come forward and talk with the priest to have your marriage blessed in the Church, and have this obstacle removed so you can receive Holy Communion. Couples who use contraception with no desire to stop using contraception are also to refrain from receiving Holy Communion. If you desire to stop using contraception, come to Confession and let the priest help remove this obstacle of receiving Holy Communion. For one to receive Holy Communion we need to attend Mass every weekend and Holy Days of Obligation—we need to be in a state of grace with no mortal sin on our souls. We need to have gone to Confession recently, or at least once a year. Missing Mass is a mortal sin, unless you have a good reason (ie, you were sick, taking care of someone who is sick or extreme weather). If you missed Mass, not for a good reason, go to Confession and confess this sin prior to receiving Holy Communion.
