CHRISTIAN DEATH: Both pagans and Christians have kept memorials of dead relatives and friends. In the early church the custom was to celebrate a remembrance of the deceased person three days following the burial and on the one-year anniversary of the person's death. The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed highlights the paschal nature of Christian death. By being plunged into the waters of baptism we die with Christ—we believe we will also rise with Christ. Alleluia!

Pastor's Note(s):

Solemnity of All Saints: Scholars suggest that it was as early as the fourth century when the public acknowledgement of saints began. Having survived 300 years of persecution, the early Church wanted to remember and celebrate those Christians who had remained faithful despite the fear, hostility and very real danger their witness to Christ created. So they allocated a special day for that purpose. And the Church has maintained the practice ever since.

Thankfully the Church did so to encourage ordinary people like us to continue witnessing to our faith in what is also a difficult and challenging time for believers. The challenge is there from those who are hostile to the Church and all that it stands for. But the greater challenge, I believe, is the indifference of so many, especially non-participants, to the essential role which the Church plays in their salvation. When people are hostile, you know you're getting through. The cold silence of indifference is another matter.

As a Spanish proverb says: this may not be the best of times, but it is our time! So, like many in the early Church and ever since, we need to make the best of our time and leave the future to the Lord. May the Saints help us to keep on doing so.

We will remember them in the General intercessions throughout November. If you also wish to have a Mass offered for the repose of a loved one, there are envelopes available on the back altar in Church. The customary offering is \$5.00.
