Fr. Steve's Quotes for Consideration:

"Technological society has succeeded in multiplying the opportunities for pleasure, but it has great difficulty in generating joy." -Blessed Pope Paul VI (1897-1978)

Today's quote is from a recently beatified pope, one which many of you will certainly remember, Pope Paul VI. Pope Paul was a prolific writer during his pontificate, and has authored many memorable quotes and writings. He was beatified (made a "blessed," one stage away from being a "saint") by Pope Francis on October 14, 2014. Pope Paul reigned as pope during a very tumultuous time in the life of our society and the Church, and often spoke with great clarity about the dangers of some of the developing social trends as well as speaking with great clarity about our need as Catholics to engage the world around us and spread the loving message of the Gospel of Christ.

This quote above is especially interesting because of the prophetic nature of it. It comes from an apostolic exhortation written by Bl. Paul VI in 1975 called *On Christian Joy*. And it is amazing to consider that already in 1975, Bl. Paul was recognizing a disturbing trend of people placing too much value on technological developments as sources of joy and happiness. One wonders what Bl. Paul VI would say if he were alive to witness the rapid development of technology that has brought us to where we are today!

The point of Bl. Paul VI's quote and my having chosen it is not to label all technological gizmos and advances as somehow bad or evil. In fact, many of the scientific and technological advances made in recent years have been tremendous gifts from God, which have brought about greater solutions to health problems, greater navigational assistance, and more efficient communication possibilities. The problem becomes when we become overly attached, or even addicted to such technologies, and when we begin to hope to find joy, happiness and contentment in them. Social media and modern technology, for all of its many benefits, can also be a source of discontent and false happiness. Joy, true joy as a fruit of the Holy Spirit, can only be found in a loving and personal relationship with God in Jesus Christ in communion with the Church. Anything else will simply never satisfy the longing of our hearts for true communion and contentment. There is a significant difference between pleasure and joy. Pleasure is fleeting, but joy is lasting, and it not only causes peace in our hearts, but true joy is contagious. Far from isolating us and focusing us only on ourselves, joy causes us to reach out in love to others, lightening their burdens through our kind joy. In a world filled with temptations and opportunities to seek momentary pleasure, true joy lived faithfully by Christ's disciples will have a profound impact. God bless you!
