Rejoice! Today is *Gaudete* Sunday! *Gaudete* is a Latin word meaning, "rejoice," and it is reserved in a special way for today, the Third Sunday of Advent. As you may have noticed at Mass this weekend, there are a few minor changes during Gaudete Sunday. First, the priest may wear rose [NOT pink!:)] colored vestments for Mass rather than the customary purple. Also, there is a pervasive theme in the readings and antiphons for Mass which are very joyful in character, exhorting God's people to rejoice and be glad. Why? Because, as St. Paul reminds us in the Second Reading for this weekend's Mass, "The Lord is near." Indeed, the Third Sunday of Advent is a sort of "halfway" point during the Advent Season, and so our Lord's coming at Christmas is drawing very near.

Now, I will readily admit that rejoicing is not always easy to do. Especially during these challenging times in which the North Shore Mining Plant has been idled, the Diocese of Duluth has declared bankruptcy, there is violence and terrorism abounding in the world, and secularism seems to pull at the seams of the practice of our faith. What reason do we have to rejoice?

We rejoice because we are a people of hope. We rejoice because God, who is Almighty, has come to rescue His people from their sins and from eternal death in Hell through His birth as a little child in Bethlehem, and His eventual death and resurrection. We rejoice because we know that God is faithful, that He is the Lord and Master of the universe, and that no matter what we may face in our lives, it is no surprise to God, who knows all things, and promises to be near us, and to carry us through our trials and tribulations. We rejoice because we are infinitely loved by a God who will stop at nothing to save us from our sins. We rejoice because we are God's own children.

And if we live joy even, and perhaps especially, in the midst of difficulty and uncertainty, you can bet that we will peak the curiosity of others. Friends, neighbors and coworkers will marvel at our joy-filled life and perhaps will want to know more. That's the point of Bl. Mother Teresa's quote above: what attracts people most to the Christian faith is joy-filled Christians. It is what people in this world long for, ache for: joy and happiness in life that comes from peace of mind in knowing that I am loved and redeemed by God who sustains me in the midst of difficulties and who supports me when I am struggling. If we truly believe that God is coming to save us, that God loves us to His own death on the cross, what do we have to fear? Rejoice! As the Prophet Zephaniah reminds us in the First Reading: "The Lord, your God, is in your midst, a mighty Savior!" God bless you!
