From the Desk of Father Steve: The Selection Process for a New Bishop



As our diocese awaits the appointment of a new bishop, I want to summarize for us the process of how a new bishop is appointed to a diocese. First of all, the right and duty to appoint a man as the bishop of a diocese rests <u>solely</u> with the pope. He is free to choose whoever he wishes. But obviously, as the shepherd of the entire worldwide Catholic Church, it would be very difficult for him to know which priest or bishop would be the best candidate for a particular diocese in a particular part of the world. So, the pope relies on a process by which names of potential candidates are presented to him with the recommendations of those "on the ground" in the location of the diocese in question. Here's how that works.

The various dioceses of a particular country comprise what are called "provinces." The province that the Diocese of Duluth belongs to is called "Region 8" which is comprised of all of the dioceses of the state of Minnesota as well as North and South Dakota. Each province has one Archdiocese within it- for

us, it is the Archdiocese of St. Paul/Minneapolis. One of the tasks of the bishops of a province is to come up with a list of names of priests that they believe would make good bishops. So, every bishop of the province may submit to the archbishop of his province the names of priests he thinks would make good bishops. Prior to the regular province meeting (usually annually), the archbishop distributes to all the bishops of the province the names and *curricula vitae* of priests which have been submitted to him. Following a discussion among the bishops at the province meeting, a vote is taken on which names to recommend. The number of names on this provincial list may vary. The vote tally, together with the minutes of the meeting, is then forwarded by the archbishop to the apostolic nuncio in Washington. The list is also submitted to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB).

The Apostolic Nuncio holds a very important role in helping to determine the new bishop of a diocese. The Apostolic Nuncio is like the ambassador from the Holy See in Rome to a given country. He represents the Holy See to the civil government and the church's hierarchy in that country. Currently, the Apostolic Nuncio to the United States is Archbishop Christophe Pierre. After receiving the list of candidates forwarded by a province, the apostolic nuncio conducts his own investigation into the suitability of the candidates. When a diocese becomes in need of a new bishop, a report is requested from the administrator of a diocese on the conditions and needs of the diocese. The report is to include the names of individuals in the diocese with whom the nuncio might consult and how to contact them. Previous bishops of the diocese are consulted, and the other bishops of the province are consulted. The president and vice president of the USCCB are also consulted.

At this point, the nuncio narrows his list and a questionnaire is sent to 20 or 30 people who know each of the candidates for their input. All material is collected and reviewed by the nuncio, and a report is prepared. Three candidates are listed alphabetically – the *terna* – with the nuncio's preference noted. All materials are then forwarded to the Congregation for Bishops in Rome. The purpose of this congregation is to assist the pope by moderating all aspects of episcopal appointments; assisting bishops in the correct exercise of their pastoral functions; and establishing episcopal conferences and reviewing their decrees as required by canon law. Its membership consists of approximately 35 cardinals and archbishops from around the world.

A cardinal from the Congregation is chosen to summarize the documentation and make a report to the full Congregation, which generally meets twice a month on Thursdays. After hearing the cardinal relator's report, the congregation discusses the appointment and then votes. The Congregation may follow the recommendation of the nuncio, chose another of the candidates on the *terna*, or even ask that another *terna* be prepared. Finally, at a private audience with the pope, the prefect (head) of the Congregation for Bishops presents the recommendations of the Congregation to the Holy Father. A few days later, the pope informs the Congregation of his decision. The Congregation then notifies the nuncio, who in turn contacts the candidate and asks if he will accept. If the answer is "yes," the Vatican is notified, and a date is set for the announcement.

Obviously, the entirety of this selection process is highly confidential in order to avoid undue outside influence in the decision-making process. And of course, we firmly believe that the Holy Spirit is guiding this process, providing the right man for the right place at the right time. This is why it is so important that we pray both for the selection process for our new bishop and for the man who will eventually be chosen -since God knows who it will be- that he be a man of great faith, compassionate heart, and firm leadership. Mass Intentions: The requested donation amount for Mass intentions in the Diocese of Duluth has changed. By Church law, only through a meeting of all of the Bishops of a province (in our case, all of the dioceses of Minnesota and North and South Dakota) can the amount requested for each Mass intention be changed. At a recent meeting of the bishops of our province, it was decided that the requested donation of \$5 per Mass intention, which has been in place since the 1990's, be increased to \$10. Please note this change is not just a change for our diocese, but is a change being made throughout all dioceses of our province. This change took effect on January 1, 2020. Also, please remember that the requested donation amount for the offering of a Mass intention is exactly that- a requested <u>donation</u>. Should a person choose to offer an amount that is less than \$10, or even no monetary donation at all, Mass intentions will still be taken and honored. Cassi's Corner

We've all probably heard the phrase, "I had an epiphany!" meaning I had a new realization, but how does that correlate to today's feast of Epiphany? Well, the feast is the celebration of when the wise men, or magi, came to worship Jesus, the newborn King. These men were astrologers who had noticed a new star in the sky. To them, it indicated a new king had been born because of the part of the sky it appeared in. The "epiphany" happens when the wise men find the Christ Child and realize Him for who He is, God. The gifts they present to Jesus are odd, but indicative of so much! Gold equated kingship; Frankincense deity; and Myrrh was an embalming oil, a symbol of death. It seems these wise men were indeed wise in realizing who Jesus was, God made man. Let us ask them today for the gift of faith to see Jesus for who He is.

There is also a tradition that families have done on this day, that I encourage you to do. You use chalk to write the following on your doorpost: 20+C+M+B+20. The 2020 for the year and CMB for the names of the wise men, Caspar, Melchoir, and Balthasar as well as the Latin phrase *Christus mansionem benedicat* meaning "May Christ bless this home." There is a blessing that goes along with it which you can find at:
