The Month of the Hearts

With gratitude and fear of God, the Catholic Church asks us to contemplate and pray to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary respectively on Friday, June 19 and Saturday, June 20, 2020. The liturgy shows us the depth of Jesus' sacrifice and love within His mother's Immaculate Heart.

Pope Pius XII wrote an Encyclical on Devotion to the Sacred Heart in which he wrote:

The Church, rejoicing in this inestimable gift, can show forth a more ardent love of her divine Founder, and can, in a more generous and effective manner, respond to that invitation which St. John the Evangelist relates as having come from Christ Himself: "And on the last and great day of the festivity, Jesus stood and cried out, saying, 'If any man thirst, let him come to Me, and let him drink that believeth in Me.'"

The Church has always valued, and still does, the devotion to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus so highly that she provides for the spread of it among Christian peoples everywhere and by every means. At the same time she uses every effort to protect it against the charges of so-called "naturalism" and "sentimentalism." In spite of this it is much to be regretted that, both in the past and in our own times, this most noble devotion does not find a place of honor and esteem among certain Christians and even occasionally not among those who profess themselves moved by zeal for the Catholic religion and the attainment of holiness. [3,8 from **HAURIETIS AQUAS**, On Devotion to the Sacred Heart, May 15, 1956.]

Also, Our Lady of Fatima asked Sister Lucy to spread the Act of Consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary all over the world by doing it for five consecutive first Saturdays along with receiving communion, making confession and keeping company with Mary by praying the fifteen mysteries of the Rosary in a spirit of reparation because of the attacks against the Virgin Mary Our Mother.

Being also the month in which we priests of the FSCB are celebrating our anniversaries of priesthood, I delighted myself during my silence with the book of Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, *Teaching and Learning the Love of God- Proclaiming a Year for Priests on the 150th Anniversary of the Dies Natalis of the Curé of Ars*, quoting that the saint states; "*The priesthood is the love of the heart of Jesus*". "[Saint John Mary Vianney] was convinced that the fervor of a priest's life depended entirely upon the Mass: 'The reason why a priest is lax is that he does not pay attention to the Mass! My God, how we ought to pity a priest who celebrates as if he were engaged in something routine!'"

I hope all parishioners at St. Peter have time to contemplate these great gifts and mysteries during the month of June and receive graces upon graces as these gifts promised.

Fr. Stefano Colombo, 56 y.o. born in Legnano, Italy near Milan.

After studying economics and working for several years, he joined the Fraternity of St. Charles Borromeo and completed his priestly formation in 1998, was ordained a priest in 1999.

His first assignment was Mexico City where he worked as a parish assistant and a teacher in high school.

In 2002 he came to the US, as the assistant for the Hispanic community at St. Mark the Evangelist Parish in Hyattsville, MD first and then teaching theology and social studies at Georgetown Visitation Preparatory School.

In 2008 he completed his Master's degree in Medieval History at the Catholic University of the Americas, in Washington DC, and began teaching social studies, history, and theology at Cristo Rey Boston.

In 2013 Fr. Colombo became the Parish Administrator of St. Clement Parish in Medford, MA.



President of U.S. Bishops' Conference Issues Statement on Supreme Court Decision on Legal Definition of "Sex" in Civil Rights Law

June 15, 2020 **From the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops**

The president of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), Archbishop José H. Gomez of Los Angeles, provided a statement on the decision issued today by the Supreme Court of the United States – combining *Bostock v. Clayton County, Ga.*, *Altitude Express v. Zarda*, and *R.G. & G.R. Harris Funeral Homes v. Equal Opportunity Employment Comm'n.* The justices ruled that the prohibition on "sex" discrimination in employment in Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 now prohibits discrimination based on "sexual orientation" and "transgender" status.

Archbishop Gomez's statement follows:

I am deeply concerned that the U.S. Supreme Court has effectively redefined the legal meaning of 'sex' in our nation's civil rights law. This is an injustice that will have implications in many areas of life.

By erasing the beautiful differences and complementary relationship between man and woman, we ignore the glory of God's creation and harm the human family, the first building block of society. Our sex, whether we are male or female, is part of God's plan for creation and for our lives. As Pope Francis has taught with such sensitivity, to live in the truth with God's intended gifts in our lives requires that we receive our bodily and sexual identity with gratitude from our Creator. No one can find true happiness by pursuing a path that is contrary to God's plan.

Every human person is made in the image and likeness of God and, without exception, must be treated with dignity, compassion, and respect. Protecting our neighbors from unjust discrimination does not require redefining human nature.

We pray that the Church, with the help of Mary, the Mother of God, will be able to continue her mission to bring Jesus Christ to every man and woman.
