STEWARDSHIP OF TIME & TALENT

There is an ongoing debate across the books of the Bible, hence in Judaism and Christianity, about faith and works. Though it is fairly clear that faith is key (Jesus helps here: he repeats over and over "your faith saved you" as he accomplishes miracles), faith is hard to fathom. Just consider this passage from 1 Thessalonians, in this Sunday's liturgy of the word: "our gospel did not come to you in word alone, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and with much conviction" (1Thes 1:5).

God the Father, Jesus says, is eternally at work (see Jn 5:17), and his communication is hardly "just" verbal, especially when we consider that the God of the Bible, since its first page, speaks in power and creates everything just by speaking. Paul's words perfectly capture these biblical fundamentals.



But Paul adds the Thessalonians (and you and me, down the line) into this picture: the gospel has come to us in power, pushed by the powerful wind of the Holy Spirit (the best example is the wind that shook the cenacle and the apostles on the day of Pentecost).

This comprehensive understanding of how God works is, in my humble opinion, the way to approach the long-debated question of works of faith.

Faith is a life, therefore everything we do may be a work of faith.

Also, life has an allotted span (our time), therefore potentially all our time is a "time of faith". Once again Paul helps us out in this unified (we might say "catholic") understanding of life and time and work: "whatever you do, in word or in deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him" (Col 3:17).

What we try to do in this communal reflection on stewardship is to educate us to this way of looking at our individual and common life: Christ has to do with everything, anytime, this is a fact (God "sustains" anything that exists), but are we aware of it?

This is what we can try to help with as a community of believers.

Look at how Christ "works" in politics, a hotly disputed subject these days as back in Palestine, two thousand years ago: "At that he said to them, "Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God." (Mt 22:21).

Here is an example of intellectual work of faith: Christ does something that marks the philosophical and political mind of the whole world, marking a distinction between religion and state that was remarkable and fundamental then as it is today: cultures that do not benefit from such wisdom are virtually incapable of democracy.

More modestly, but similarly, we are called every day to decide how to allot our time and our energies in creative and fruitful ways. How much does our faith help us to do it?

STEWARDSHIP OF TIME & TALENT

Many of us know the parable of the talents. Three servants are given talents to care for on behalf of their master. Two of them invest the talents, develop them, and return them and more to the master. They are rewarded. The third hides the one talent he received and buried it in the ground. He returns them to his master, but has done nothing with them, and is punished.

While we understand the term talents in the parable to refer to money, I heard a speaker at a stewardship conference last year encourage us to take the word more literally for how we use it today. Since then I have never quite heard the story in the same way.

God has given each of us special gifts: talents that we are to share with the world around us. He did not give us these gifts to bury them and have them hidden, use them only when it is convenient to us, or keep them to ourselves. He would rather we use them in the world to bring others joy, to serve others, and bring others closer to Him.

Too often it is easy for us to think about our service to God and His Church as something we will get to. I will volunteer once my kids are grown, or once I find my spouse, or after I retire. I am guilty of this. As a working mother of three young children, it can be easy for me to look at opportunities of service and pass on them because of how busy I am.

But when I do that I am the servant that buries her talents, I have been given the gifts of time and ability by God, and rather than use them even in small ways, I bury them away. And as the parable tells us that is not what God wants.

Let us think about how and where we use our talents. Do they serve God? Is there something you can do to help bring others closer to God? For some of us that may just be limited to prayer, but I ask you to discern if God is calling you to something during this time. One thing I felt called to do during this COVID time is ushering at Mass. Of course, I would not say that is a talent of mine, but something I can do during this time to help bring others closer to God. Right now, the usher role is essential for us to be able to come together for Mass and continue to offer a safe place to worship God and receive the Eucharist.

It takes a lot for our parish to operate well; it cannot happen without volunteers. Has God given you the ability and time to invest a bit more? In the mail, parishioners will be receiving a letter from Fr. Ettore and a Stewardship of Time & Talent Commitment card. I ask that you read his letter and the commitment card to try discerning if God is calling you to use your time and gifts in a new way.
