OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

Dear friends,

The liturgical year is like a mirror for our life. Through the liturgy, the Church - like a mother - takes us by hand and accompanies us to consider our lives in light of the mysteries of the life of Christ. This Sunday we are led to the last stage of this journey, where everything is summarized: the solemnity of Jesus Christ King of the universe.

The kingship of Christ is the plot and climax of the entire liturgical year, and of every Christian existence. Jesus is "the center of the universe and of history", the profound meaning of all things and the destiny of all hearts. St. Paul gives us words to illuminate this mystery: In him were created all things ... All things were created through him and for him... In him, all things hold together... For in him all the fullness was pleased to dwell, and through him to reconcile all things for him, making peace by the blood of his cross through him.

Paul's words, while describing the divinity of Christ, reveal to us a central aspect of his power: He is the savior, the source of reconciliation and pacification of all things. Not by chance, on today's solemnity, the Gospel presents Jesus in front of Pilate, in the midst of his passion. Quickly thereafter we see him crowned with thorns and wrapped in the purple mantle of his blood. It is an unusual image for a king. And in fact, first the chiefs of the people, then the soldiers, and finally one of the two thieves crucified with him, provoke Jesus to manifest his kingship by descending from the cross. It is the only way the world knows to exercise kingship and power: to save oneself. Instead, Jesus remains silent on the cross. From there he addresses the good thief, expressing the true meaning of his power: today you will be with me in Paradise. Precisely at the moment of the highest humiliation and powerlessness, Jesus makes a promise that God alone can make and in the redemption he supremely manifests his kingship. He does not save himself in order to save all of us.

In my opinion, the words of Benedict XVI in the opening Mass of his pontificate constitute the clearest comment to all of this and at the same time also offer us a key to understand what Pope Francis is saying to the Church:

(It is not power, but love that redeems us! [...] How often we wish that God would show himself stronger, that he would strike decisively, defeating evil and creating a better world. All ideologies of power justify themselves in exactly this way, they justify the destruction of whatever would stand in the way of progress and the liberation of humanity. We suffer on account of God's patience. And yet, we all need his patience. God, who became a lamb, tells us that the world is saved by the Crucified One, not by those who crucified him. The world is redeemed by the patience of God. It is destroyed by the impatience of man).

STEWARDSHIP OF TIME & TALENT


Several weeks back you received a letter along with a pledge card in the mail. We wish to thank those who filled out a pledge card and for giving your time and talents to the church.

The parish is looking for a <u>Full Time Maintenance Worker</u> for the parish and school. This position would report to our Maintenance Supervisor and would work the shift of 12:30pm to 8:30pm.

The essential functions of this role are as follows:

Dear Church of St. Peter parishioners,

The 2021 school year is ending on November 30 at St. Anthony school in our sister parish in Paraguay, and it is time to prepare for the new year starting in February 2022. This past year has brought devastation and anguish to the students and their families. There has been much sickness and death, resulting in the loss of parents, siblings, grandparents, friends and neighbors, and has left behind a shattered economy. Fr. Miguel and the community share in the children's grief.

In spite of the difficulties being faced, it is time to plan for the new school year. A full academic sponsorship is \$300 per student which includes tuition, uniforms, books, supplies and snacks. Since 2010 the monthly fee for families is only \$10 per student per month which is still a financial burden for most. This low monthly fee is only possible because of the prayers and financial support of the Church of St. Peter parishioners! Your generosity also supports the formation of future Franciscan priests, as well as providing meals to more than two thousand community members each month.




