

"The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; Upon those who lived in a land of gloom a light has shone" (Is 9:1).

Christmas is a mystery of light. Jesus' birth in Bethlehem brings new light and glory to the world and our lives, creating a family, a new home, relationships illuminated by grace. As St. Bernard wrote: "The incarnation teaches us how much God cares for us and what he thinks and feels about us" (Sermo 1 in Epiphania Domini).

The birth of Jesus fulfills Scripture, the cosmos, history, and our hearts. It is the fulfillment of all desire.

After the original sin, Adam and Eve fell into darkness. This darkness is characterized by fear, shame, isolation, and a false image of God as someone who is against us. They were hiding from each other and God: "The LORD God then called to the man and asked him: 'Where are you?' He answered, 'I heard you in the garden; but I was afraid, because I was naked, so I hid'" (Gen 3:9–10).

Fear, shame, and isolation are the poison that the ancient serpent injected into our hearts. Jesus came to conquer fear with faith, shame with hope, and isolation with love.

Christmas is the proclamation that God comes to rescue us! No more darkness: "the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it" (Jn 1:5)

In a famous sermon, pope Saint Leo the Great said: "Christian, remember your dignity [...] Do not forget that you have been rescued from the power of darkness and brought into the light of God's kingdom" (Sermo 1 in Nativitate Domini). The encounter with Christ restores our dignity as beloved sons and daughters of God, destroying any false identities. We are free, and we are no more enslaved people!

God's light heals us from brokenness. The experience of God's love restores us and gives us a new heart. As we are receptive to God's light, we are transformed into God's children: "But to those who did accept him he gave power to become children of God" (Jn 1:12). Through baptism, we became truly a new creation, and we have received a superabundance of gifts: "From his fullness have we all received, grace upon grace" (Jn 1:16).

The world is in the darkness and needs God's light. To bring light to the world is the mission of the Church. We are called to build up a family, a home for our hearts, a place with the Holy Family as a model.

May Mary, with her heart filled with love beyond all telling, obtain the grace that the new light of God's glory shines upon the eyes of our hearts.




