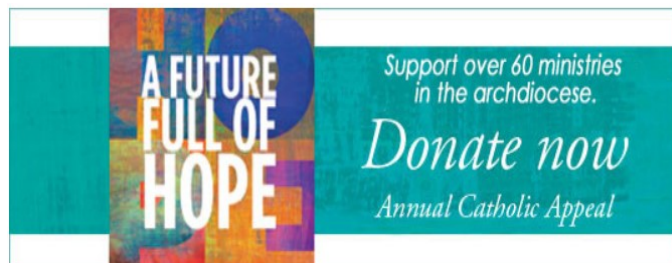

THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

The Gospel today teaches us that God is always with us! The disciples are not looking for the Christ- they only know the dead Jesus...not the living Christ. It is Christ who is looking for them. It is Christ who comes into their midst. Here is the great mystery of faith. In every moment of our lives, in the brightest and in the darkest of times, it is God who reveals Himself in new and unexpected ways. And God reveals Himself to us not when we seek, demand or ask for it...God reveals Himself when we do not search for Him. The great truth of this Gospel is that we are not in control....God is. And no matter when God reveals himself to us His message is always the same: "Peace be with you".

ANNUAL CATHOLIC APPEAL

This coming week you will receive a letter from Archbishop Etienne asking for your participation in the Archdiocesan Annual Appeal. Each year at this time, we pause and consider all the good that is done because we give: the homeless are sheltered; the elderly are cared for; our seminarians are prepared for future ministry, and so much more. The support of every parish is crucial to the success of the Archdiocese and its many ministries and services. We have an archdiocesan assessed goal of \$103,549 for our share of this year's campaign. We are asking that EVERYONE support the Appeal this year in some way. YOUR participation is vital to our success as a parish - We are counting on you to help us achieve our goal.

THE EASTER SEASON

Although the obligation to attend Mass is still dispensed by Archbishop Etienne, he does urge all Catholics to attend an Easter Season Mass. If you were not able to attend an Easter Mass you are invited to an Easter Season Mass in the coming weeks. The Easter Season lasts 50 days...longer than Lent. This is the Year of the Eucharist and celebrating the Eucharist means to give thanks, which is always best done in community. Being together in community also provides emotional nourishment and support, something we have missed for a long time. So we invite those who have been away to join us in community as we celebrate the Eucharist and give thanks to God.

Reflection for April 18, 2021

*“Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. **You are witnesses of these things.**”*

Well, we’re now in the time after Jesus’ resurrection, where He makes two appearances to His disciples before His ascension into heaven. The first appearance is to the two disciples on their way to Emmaus. (That’s where this week’s gospel begins.) The second appearance takes place in Jerusalem. I have to tell you, I looked up all of the appearances that Jesus made to His disciples in all four gospels, and I made a very important discovery. These guys were either clueless about whom this person was who appeared to them, or they were in disbelief that this person could actually be Jesus, or “they were startled and terrified and thought that they were seeing a ghost.” That’s what happens in Luke’s gospel, our reading for this Sunday.

I guess it’s easy for us to judge these “characters” who followed Jesus throughout His public life. You would have thought that they might have picked up on some of what Jesus shared with them about what was to happen to Him. But, they did not. And for good reason. Would we have believed if He told us He would be killed, and then He would rise from the dead? I don’t think so. We have the good fortune of being able to read what the gospel writers have shared with us, because they were witnesses to this unbelievable event. Let’s read today’s gospel and come to our own conclusion.

Gospel

[Lk 24:35-48](#)

The two disciples recounted what had taken place on the way, and how Jesus was made known to them in the breaking of bread. While they were still speaking about this, he stood in their midst and said to them, “Peace be with you.” But they were startled and terrified and thought that they were seeing a ghost. Then he said to them, “Why are you troubled?

And why do questions arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet, that it is I myself. Touch me and see, because a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you can see I have.” And as he said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. While they were still incredulous for joy and were amazed, he asked them, “Have you anything here to eat?” They gave him a piece of baked fish; he took it and ate it in front of them. He said to them, “These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the law of Moses and in the prophets and psalms must be fulfilled. Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures. And he said to them, “Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. **You are witnesses of these things.**”

Did you notice in this reading — and in all the other gospels — that when Jesus greets His disciples, the first thing that He says to them is, “Peace be with you.” Why does He do this, and what does it really mean? Does Jesus use the “peace” word just to show that He wishes His disciples to be free from conflict. OR, do His words have a deeper meaning? Yes, and yes to both questions. Of course Jesus wants us to be free of worries and fears. But, He also wants us to experience a deeper sense of knowing all is well because He is with us. Why should we be frightened when we know full well that Jesus is our loving and merciful Lord. I also bolded the last line of the gospel because of its importance in our lives. Jesus tells His disciples that they are to be His witnesses of this good news of the forgiveness of sins. He asks us to do the same — to be examples of this message of repentance and forgiveness, and to proclaim this message by how we live our lives.

Peace be with you. ALLELUIA!

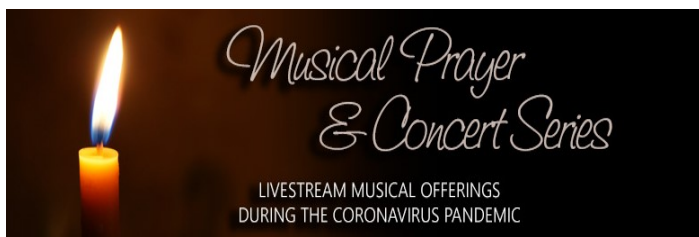

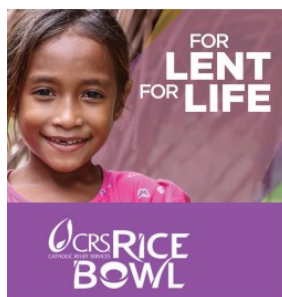
