ARCHDIOCESE OF SEATTLE RELEASES SYNOD SYNTHESIS REPORT

The Archdiocese of Seattle submitted its Synod Synthesis Re-port to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) on June 30, officially concluding the local consultative process of Pope Francis' global synod. 

Gospel Reading

Luke 12:13-21

A person's life does not consist of possessions.

Family Connection

Family life helps us learn about the values of solidarity and the common good. As a family, we strive to respect the rights of each family member and make decisions that promote the common good of the family. Talk about what it would be like if the family ordered a pizza and then divided it unevenly, with some members getting as many pieces as they wanted while others got only a half slice. Talk about how you work to make sure that everyone in the family has his or her fair share.

Talk about how your family is also a member of the human family, called to share the goods of creation fairly and justly. Explain that in this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus challenges us to remember that the goods of the world are intended to be shared by all. Read aloud Luke 12:13-21. Talk about the parable of the rich fool and ask family members to describe what they think he did wrong. Emphasize that although the man in the story doesn't seem bad, Jesus points out that this man's flaw was that he was thinking only about himself and his own comfort and security. Emphasize that when we fail to think about the needs of others, we call that a sin of omission.

Remind your children that each time we go to Mass, we ask forgiveness for what we have done and for what we have failed to do. We call this prayer the *Confiteor*. End this time together by praying the *Confiteor* ("I confess to almighty God...").

Reflection for July 31, 2022

"Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions."

Yes, I'm just like you. I get taken in by some of the headlines on the internet. The other day one of these headlines stated, "The richest billionaire in each state." I couldn't help myself, so I clicked on the headline to see who has all that money. We know, of course, who happens to be the richest person in the world (currently). It's our neighbor right here in the Seattle area — Jeff Bezos — owner of Amazon. He's worth — are you ready for this? — \$172 billion dollars! That's downright silly, isn't it? What is Mr. Bezos going to do with all those billions of dollars? Hopefully — and I believe he is — he is using a lot of his fortune to help others in our world, just like Bill Gates and others American billionaires. But, that's not my point. Let's read today's gospel to get Jesus' point of view on the subject of worldly possessions.

Gospel Lk 12:13-21

Someone in the crowd said to Jesus, "Teacher, tell my brother to share the inheritance with me." He replied to him, "Friend, who appointed me as your judge and arbitrator?"

Then he said to the crowd, "Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions." Then he told them a parable.

"There was a rich man whose land produced a bountiful harvest. He asked himself, 'What shall I do, for I do not have space to store my harvest?' And he said, 'This is what I shall do: I shall tear down my barns and build larger ones. There I shall store all my grain and other goods and I shall say to myself, "Now as for you, you have so many good things stored up for many years, rest, eat, drink, be merry!"'

But God said to him, 'You fool, this night your life will be demanded of you; and the things you have prepared, to whom will they belong?' Thus will it be for all who store up treasure for themselves but are not rich in what matters to God."

So, what about us mere mortals? What's our story? To what extent are we influenced by greed for more material possessions? In our capitalistic society, we are focused on acquiring more wealth, more possessions, more status. In today's gospel, Jesus reminds us that when we leave all of these things behind, we will be asked what spiritual riches we have accumulated. Yes, this parable is told as a warning against greed. But Luke's theme carries a much deeper meaning, and that meaning is this: What are the ways in which we are "rich towards God?" How about you? Are you a billionaire in the spiritual aspect of focusing on God? There's some food for thought. AMEN!




