Reflection for July 2 2023 By: Ron Czarney — Whole Community Catechesis

". . . Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for My sake will find it."

Every morning when I wake up, I have a plan for the day. I usually begin by thinking about what I'll have for breakfast. Once I've decided on this, I think about what I'll do for the rest of the day: go to daily Mass, do some gardening, feed the neighborhood dogs with treats, call a friend or two to just say hello, do some shopping with my wife — really just enjoy the day with whomever I might encounter. Life is good.

But wait a minute. What is this that Jesus is saying? "Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for My sake will find it?" Let's read today's gospel and see if we can figure out what Jesus is saying.

Gospel Mt 10:37-42

Jesus said to his apostles:

"Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever does not take up his cross and follow after me is not worthy of me. Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it.

"Whoever receives you receives me, and whoever receives me receives the one who sent me.

Whoever receives a prophet because he is a prophet will receive a prophet's reward, and whoever receives a righteous man because he is a righteous man will receive a righteous man's reward. And whoever gives only a cup of cold water to one of these little ones to drink because the little one is a disciple—amen, I say to you, he will surely not lose his reward."

So, the things that I plan to do each day is my "to do list." Do you have one of these lists? I'm guessing you do. I'm sure it's only a mental list, but that's what mine is too. You probably wake up thinking about the homework you might have to complete before going to class, what you'll take for lunch, how well you'll do at soccer practice later in the afternoon. Or, now that it's summer, you're thinking about what things you can do to have some fun: swimming, biking, vacations to visit relatives. You get the drift, right? In today's gospel, Jesus is making us think about what is important in our "to do list." Is it important to love our moms and dads? Of course it is! But, then He says that if we love our moms and dads more than Him, we are not worthy of Him. Say what?! Okay! Okay! Calm down! Jesus has your attention now, doesn't He? Here's what I think He is telling us: His words about family are simply an invitation to put things in order. When we love God first, not only do we love our family more, but this love for our families is more selfless and life-giving. When we put God first, we encounter His love in the ordinary flow of life. So, work on your "to do list" and make sure God is at the very top — and your reward will surely be great! AMEN!
