

Mass Schedule

Weekday 9:00 am Mass: Reservations are no longer needed.

Sunday Mass: Reservations for the 8:30 and 10:30 am Sunday Masses are required and can be made by calling the Pastoral Office at (626) 291-5900 by 3:00 pm on Friday of each week. These are the only weekend Masses offered at this time. Please also call the office by Noon on Fridays if you need to cancel a reservation.

'Drive-thru' Communion Reception Line

For those who prefer not to come to public mass at this time, there will be a "drive thru" communion line offered each Sunday from 11:45 am to 12:20 pm. Please line up going south on Cloverly Avenue by car and turn into the church parking lot. PLEASE DO NOT PARK.

We will stand and distribute communion to people in the car in the hand. Please wear a mask as we approach your car. Drive off safely through exit on Broadway.

'Drive-thru Confessions

"Drive-thru" Confessions will now be offered at 1:00 pm on Saturdays. Please wear a mask and drive through the church parking lot where you will be directed through the back alley to approach one of the priests who will hear your brief confession from outside the passenger side of the car.

If there are multiple people in the car, the passenger/s may exit and stand at a safe distance and we will come to them after hearing the driver's confession. This is not a prolonged counseling moment: we want anybody who wants a brief confession following these months of lockdown to have the opportunity, so please be prepared and expedient. Please drive out safely the rear gate onto Live Oak Avenue.


Father Mark's Corner



Sunday Readings

Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading 1

2 Kgs 4:8–11, 14–16a

One day Elisha came to Shunem, where there was a woman of influence, who urged him to dine with her. Afterward, whenever he passed by, he used to stop there to dine. So she said to her husband, “I know that Elisha is a holy man of God. Since he visits us often, let us arrange a little room on the roof and furnish it for him with a bed, table, chair, and lamp, so that when he comes to us he can stay there.” Sometime later Elisha arrived and stayed in the room overnight.

Later Elisha asked, “Can something be done for her?” His servant Gehazi answered, “Yes! She has no son, and her husband is getting on in years.” Elisha said, “Call her.” When the woman had been called and stood at the door, Elisha promised, “This time next year you will be fondling a baby son.”

Brothers and sisters: Are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life.

If, then, we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with him. We know that Christ, raised from the dead, dies no more; death no longer has power over him. As to his death, he died to sin once and for all; as to his life, he lives for God. Consequently, you too must think of yourselves as dead to sin and living for God in Christ Jesus.

Jesus said to his apostles: “Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever does not take up his cross and follow after me is not worthy of me. Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it.

“Whoever receives you receives me, and whoever receives me receives the one who sent me. Whoever receives a prophet because he is a prophet will receive a prophet’s reward, and whoever receives a righteous man because he is a righteous man will receive a righteous man’s reward.

And whoever gives only a cup of cold water to one of these little ones to drink because the little one is a disciple—amen, I say to you, he will surely not lose his reward.”

Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

June 28, 2020



On first reading, our Gospel seems very harsh. The idea of taking up our cross can be fearful or have negative connotations, as if it were something only a few can do. It is also confusing. Scripture tells us to honor our father and mother, and yet here are told we must love Jesus more than our parents or children, or we are not worthy. The message that Jesus intends to convey, however, is not to give up these people, but rather to choose Christ first.

Sometimes this means being countercultural. For a family, how do we make choices to keep Christ in the picture? It could mean that when you make plans to take the family to that water park for the weekend, you should also locate the local church so you can attend Mass. Or maybe it means not placing your child on the soccer team with 10 a.m. Sunday games, or rescheduling another part of your life to keep Christ foremost. Perhaps it is something as simple as locking yourself in the bathroom for five minutes so that you have time to pray. Maybe it means listening to an audiobook of scriptures on your commute to work. All we do is for naught if we do not include Christ.

Whoever gives only a cup of cold water to one of these little ones to drink because the little one is a disciple — amen, I say to you, he will surely not lose his reward.

Matthew 10:42

THERE ARE MANY “CUPS OF WATER”

Don't get caught up in taking this scripture literally. Yes, you may give someone a glass of water, invite the staff of your parish for a meal, hand an apple or a dollar bill to a homeless person, or take a shift in a shelter. But sometimes, what is being asked for is simply a kind word or a helping hand. Seeing an elderly person having trouble and helping them through the crosswalk, calming someone's toddler in the grocery store while they pay their bill. Offer a smile, a compliment, or a word of encouragement. Say hello to a stranger. We do not know who is parched with loneliness or feeling overwhelmed. Look for the Christ in others and respond with simple kindness and hospitality.

Prevent underage drinking

The National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism reports that nearly 5,000 children under the age of 21 die from alcohol-related incidents every year.

Studies show that children as young as 12 may be exposed to alcohol and drugs, and nearly 75% of high school seniors have tried alcohol at least once.

Important Reminders

- While on church property, please remember to maintain physical distance from others.
- Masks/Face Coverings are required out of respect for ALL those attending.
- The seating setup in the church also maintains physically distancing. The requirement of needing to be from the same household to sit together will not be strictly enforced, but is encouraged. Please make responsible decisions for you and your family.
- **Arrive early:** Doors open 30 minutes prior to the service and will be closed and locked when Mass begins. Late arrivals will not be admitted.
- Church entry will be from the main doors on Cloverly Avenue. Attendees will be checked in and ushered to their seat. Hand sanitizer will be available. Please know that pews will be sanitized after each service.
- A physical collection will not be taken during the Mass. We thank you for remembering St. Luke in your financial tithing during this very difficult time for all of us. Offerings can be mailed or dropped off at the Pastoral Office (can leave in the office mailbox) or contributed online.
- During Mass, we will not have a physical sign of peace. Singing will not take place and missalettes or songbooks will not be available in the pews for surface safety.
- The dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass is extended indefinitely. People who are 65 or older, have a weakened immune system, or have a chronic medical condition are encouraged to stay home, especially since we are experiencing a spike in virus infections. If you are sick, you MUST remain at home. Please do not place yourself or others in danger of illness and death.

As we continue to evaluate our current situation, we will re-evaluate all procedures and schedules and adapt to what current safety protocols or Archdiocesan directives are in place.

Please Remember:

- Wear Masks**
Face-coverings are to be worn in & around the church.

- Stay 6 ft Apart**
Physical distancing is practiced in the church & on the church property.

- Holy Eucharist**
Communion will be distributed only in the hand, not by the cup.

No hand shakes during the sign-of-peace.

- Tithing**
Large baskets located at the back of the church for your envelopes or donations.

- Single Entry/Exit**
Please use the single entry when entering & exiting the church.

- Holy Water**
