Senior Citizen Bingo & Potluck



Confirmation Retreat Collection



L.A. Catholics work together to protect children

This program helps prevent child sexual abuse by raising awareness among staff and volunteers, and educating them on warning signs of abuse, potentially unsafe or inappropriate scenarios, and how to respond to suspicious behavior. January is National Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention Month

January is National Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention Month, as decreed by presidential proclamation. The month of January was first declared as such in 2010 by President Barack Obama. January is also known as Human Trafficking Awareness Month. It is a key time for us all to educate ourselves about human trafficking.

Slavery and human trafficking are historic problems and sadly these are issues which continue to grow worldwide. The estimated number of victims of trafficking globally rose by 12 percent between 2016 and 2021 according to the latest international consensus study. Today, some 27.6 million people around the world are living without the freedom to choose how they live and work.

Human trafficking takes many forms, the most common being trafficking for sexual exploitation and trafficking for the purposes of forced labor. It may be surprising that many people in our own communities are vulnerable, especially our youth. In the United States we are seeing an increase in the number of instances reported. The growth of trafficking is possible because the underlying conditions that make people vulnerable to sex and labor trafficking still exist. Poverty, environmental destruction, racism, discrimination, and gender and economic inequity persist as underlying drivers of human trafficking around the globe.

Migration, both internal and to another country, legally and otherwise, is a key vulnerability for human trafficking because migrants so often fall outside of the full legal protections of their countries of origin, countries of transit, and countries of destination. Those victimized by human traffickers in the United States are disproportionately from Latin America, most frequently from Mexico. (From the Polaris Project, https://polarisproject.org/)

Other contributors to human trafficking include pornography and the recent COVID pandemic. Porn viewing increases the demand for sex trafficking. The National Human Trafficking Hotline reported that pornography was the 3rd-most common form of sex trafficking. A disturbing fact is that more than 1 in 5 victims of sex trafficking are children, and of those that are forced into the porn industry, the average age of starting is 12. The COVID pandemic contributed to sexual exploitation due to school closures, while the economic downturn and loss of employment led to labor trafficking.

National Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention Month, January 2023, is a good time for us to take these messages to our workplaces, our churches, our schools, our elected representatives and everywhere else. Here are some resources if you would like to learn more:

- The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) Anti-Trafficking Program, https://www.usccb.org/topics/anti-trafficking-program, educates on the scourge of human trafficking as an offense against fundamental dignity of the human person, advocates for an end to modern day slavery, provides training and technical assistance on this issue, and supports survivors through community-based services.

- The Coalition to Abolish Slavery and Trafficking (CAST) (https://www.castla.org) is a Los Angeles—based nonprofit organization that is working to put an end to modern slavery and human trafficking through comprehensive, life-transforming services to survivors and a platform to advocate for groundbreaking policies and legislation.
- Mary Queen of Heaven Missionaries (https://www.mqhm.org) The sisters do most of their work with human trafficking victims in the Philippines. Their newly operational HOME OF LOVE USA is their rescue and rehabilitation home in the San Gabriel Valley.
- The Polaris Project, https://polarisproject.org, operates the U.S. National Human Trafficking Hotline, collects data, conducts research, and dismantles systems that contribute to human trafficking.
