Dear Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the feast of the Presentation of the Lord which occurs forty days after the birth of Jesus. This is a feast we meditate on, every time we pray the fourth joyful mystery of the rosary. "In obedience to the Old Law, Mary and Joseph present Jesus in the Temple. Traditionally this was the date that Christmas ended. For us, being presented in the temple, is like when our parents and Godparents present us for baptism. The Catechism tells us that it is at that moment at baptism that we are consecrated to God the Father. From that moment on we are different as we become sons and daughters of God. We are called to live our lives accordingly. It is important to renew our consecration often which we do when we receive the sacraments. Every Mass in fact is an opportunity to strengthen our consecration and rededicate ourselves to the Lord. In fact, every time we profess our faith in the Creed at Mass after the homily, we are renewing the profession made for us at our baptism. Likewise, every time we encounter Christ and confess our sins to him through the priest in the Sacrament of Penance, we ask him to return us to that interior state of holy consecration that we first experienced on the day of our baptism, when we were covered with a white garment of consecration and told to take that garment, unstained, to meet Christ when he comes. Today's feast is an open invitation for us to renew our dedication to the Lord: To offer him our entire being, our thoughts, our works, everything we are, and everything we do. Over the centuries, Christians have popularly called this feast Candlemas or the "Mass of Candles." At our baptism, our godfathers came to light a baptismal candle from the paschal or Easter candle, and the priest said, "Receive the Light of Christ!" We were told to keep that light burning brightly. Jesus, as Simeon says in today's Gospel, is a "light of revelation to the Gentiles." He is the Light of the World. But, in the Sermon on the Mount, he also calls us to be the Light of the World. The way those two truths go together is that we are supposed to be burning with his light. Our baptismal candle being lit from the Pascal or Easter candle, points to the reality that we receive our light from Christ, who wants to make us candles, taking his light to the whole world, a world in which there often is so much darkness. Jesus said to Saint Teresa of Calcutta, "Come, be my Light." He says the same thing to each of us today, "Come, be my light." On this Feast of the Presentation of Jesus, may we renew our commitment made for us by our parents and godparents at baptism in living our Catholic faith and to bring the light of Christ to those in your life! 
