Dear Parishioners,

This week we are reminded that Our Lord will feed us and that he will take care of all our needs. In our first reading through Isaiah Our Lord asks us, "why spend your money on what is not bread?" "Why spend your wages on what fails to satisfy?" That bread is our faith. It is the way Jesus nourishes our soul. We can choose to focus on the things of the world or the things of God. When we focus on God everything else in our life falls into place. In our Gospel Jesus feeds the 5000 along with their wives and children. He takes what his disciples have, 5 loaves of bread and 2 fish and confects a miracle to multiply it to fill everyone. Notice how Our Lord makes the point how "they all ate and were satisfied." It is like when we receive Holy Communion. It satisfies the soul and gives us the strength to carry on. When we eat food the rule is that the less becomes the greater. And in every case the food we eat is united to our flesh because it is less than us. But, there is one exception. And, of course that is when we receive Holy Communion who is God. That is because the Eucharist being the true presence of Jesus who is God, is greater than us. So, in this case God, doesn't become us, rather we become God. And that is something to keep in mind that every time we receive Holy Communion in the state of grace (free of mortal sin) we become more and more like Christ; we become more holy, wise, strong, at peace and filled with joy. When we want to grow in holiness the bread of life is the key and to receive Holy Communion as often as possible in the state of grace. That's why going to Mass even more than once a week and perhaps daily is so important. Notice after everyone ate and were satisfied there were twelve wicker baskets of bread left over. These could stand for the 12 tribes of Israel of Our Lord's chosen people whom our savior would come out of. And also these 12 wicker baskets of bread left over can stand for the 12 Apostles whom Jesus told to "do this in memory of me" to confect the Mass and keep him present in the Catholic Church to us, the new chosen people. Further, it is not by accident that in this passage about the multiplication of the 5000 loaves Jesus uses the same exact verbs as he did in the Last Supper when he celebrated the first Mass where he made himself present in the bread and wine entirely changing the substance of bread and wine into his flesh and blood for the first time. When "looking up to Heaven he said the blessing, broke the loaves and gave them to the disciples" who in turn gave them to the crowds. He blessed, broke and gave just as he did at the Last Supper in the Mass. In one of her writings, author and mystic Carol Houselander explains that, "It is estimated that in every second of the day and night, four elevations of the Host take place. I never cease to wonder at this or to rejoice in the knowledge that there is never a second of one's life in which one cannot lift up one's heart to God in the heart of Christ lifted up in the host...Think too how everywhere where Christ is lifted up men are bowed down in adoration...all adoring God, all in communion with one another, all in communion with the Holy Father, all in communion with you and me. That is something beautiful and powerful to keep in mind, how we are united to the Mass that is always being offered somewhere. I encourage you to have strong devotion in the Eucharist. Spend more and more time praying before the Eucharist and receiving Jesus well! It will change your life!




