Good Sunday morning! Today we celebrate the final Sunday in Ordinary Time - and the readings are very much about the end of times. As Catholics, these readings should not make us afraid, but rather have hope in the Resurrection. They should also invite us to examine the daily choices we make.

Please pray for our eighth graders today as they make a commitment in their journey towards final initiation (Confirmation) in the Catholic Church. Today they will petition Fr. Carlin to ask the bishop to confirm them in April. They have written letters to Fr. Carlin. They will sign the Rite of Enrollment book and during Mass will be called forward to profess their faith. All of this will happen at the 10am Mass.

On Monday, the parents of second graders and eighth graders who are receiving sacraments this school year will be in attendance at our final mandatory parent meeting. It will begin at 7pm and this time it will be IN THE GYM. The Book Fair is set up in Lower Parish Hall.

There were 18 teams - more than ever previously competing. Our team members are 8th graders Owen Farrell, Jacob Taylor, Victoria Johns, Thomas Gordan and Chloe Mouzaya, and 7th graders Chloe Egnaczyk, Arianna Gambrel, Isabella Dorsey, and Irena Gordan. Only five members compete each month - Mr. McKay and Mrs. Mazur look at MAP scores and talk with the team in order to determine who will be best for the topic each month. I'd say that is excellent teamwork and cooperation! We are so proud of all of our Classroom of Champions team members and moderators.

This week includes two more days of the Book Fair on Monday and Tuesday, bonus recycling week for paper/boxes, and on Saturday is the clothing drive. All of these are sponsored by our amazing PTU. The Book Fair is open on Sunday from 9:30am-2pm as well as Monday and Tuesday during the school day and until 3:30pm. It is in the Lower Parish Hall. Books make great gifts!
