

4th Sunday of Advent Reflection on the Gospel

"Here I am, God's servant. Let it happen to me as you say."

__ Luke 1:26-38

Mary, whose body becomes home to God, responds three times in Luke's story of her call. Three times the angel Gabriel, God's messenger, speaks to her.

- To the angel's greeting, "Greetings, favored one, God is with you," Mary feels perplexed and wonders what kind of greeting this can be.
- To Gabriel's invitation to give birth to God's Son, Mary questions, "How can this be since I am a virgin?"
- To Gabriel's promise, God will do the impossible in her, Mary says "yes".

This dialogue outlines the journey of a call from God. The journey moves from perplexity, to certainty that the call cannot be, to confidence that God can do the impossible in me. The human of God in Mary's womb, she will feel the first stirrings of salvation within herself. God's Son will look like her. She will nurse and rock him after he is born.

With Mary's **yes** to God's invitation, the Creator makes a new move. God becomes one of us to reveal who God is. Mary trusts God's word. In her Magnificat which we prayed as last Sunday's responsorial, Mary blesses God for showing mercy, for raising up the poor, for filling the hungry. In her yes, she trusts God's promises to her people and to her.

Reservations must be made by Fridays at 12:00 p.m. Parishioners who are particularly vulnerable (e.g., over the age of 60, those with serious underlying health conditions: high blood pressure, diabetes, obesity, asthma, and those whose immune system is compromised, heart or lung conditions, or who are immune-compromised), and those who are ill or suspect they may be ill, should remain at home. Livestreaming of our Sunday Mass on our STA YouTube and Facebook Live channels will continue each Sunday, with Mass at 9:30 a.m.

To attend in-person, you must register online and have a confirmed reservation to attend Mass. This includes anyone who may be serving in any capacity. Confirmation numbers are sent once you complete the full reservations process.

Please visit the STA website to complete the COVID-19 Questionnaire and Liability Waiver. Space is limited and registration is mandatory.

The online reservation system will open at 12pm on Sunday and will close for each Mass 48 hours prior to the date of service.

There will be no same-day reservations. Mass will be livestreamed on Christmas Eve with a rebroadcast on Christmas Day. Sunday Mass will be livestreamed as usual.
