

Sunday Gospel Reflection

MARY, OUR HOLY QUEEN, IS ENTHRONED ABOVE

— Luke 1:39-56

The Solemnity of the Assumption commemorates the mystery of the Blessed Virgin Mary being taken body and soul into heaven. As a special privilege, her body did not suffer the corruption of the tomb. We believe Mary was conceived without sin because Jesus could not be born in a sinful vessel. As a result of being preserved from Original Sin, Mary did not have concupiscence, which is our inclination to sin. Romans 6:23 says, “For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.” Since Mary never committed any sins, she did not have to die. I believe she freely chose to die in solidarity with Her Son Jesus. But her body did not remain in death.

Mary did however have problems and suffering during her earthly life. As Simeon foretold in Luke 2: 34-35, “Behold, this child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted (and you yourself a sword shall pierce) so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed.” To escape King Herod, she fled with Joseph and the Baby Jesus into exile in Egypt. Mary and Joseph searched for the Boy Jesus for three days when He was in the Temple. She met Jesus on the road to Calvary and stood at the foot of His Cross. Mary was given into the care of John by Jesus, and she received His Body when it was taken down from the Cross. Mary, our Holy Queen, is enthroned in heaven above.

Our first reading from the Book of Revelations says: “A great sign appeared in the sky, a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars. She was with child and wailed aloud in pain as she labored to give birth.



Then another sign appeared in the sky; it was a huge red dragon, with seven heads and ten horns, and on its heads were seven diadems... Then the dragon stood before the woman about to give birth, to devour her child when she gave birth. She gave birth to a son, a male child, destined to rule all the nations with an iron rod. Her child was caught up to God and his throne. The woman herself fled into the desert where she had a place prepared by God. Then I heard a loud voice in heaven say: 'Now have salvation and power come, and the Kingdom of our God and the authority of his Anointed One.'

Church, the world and the Devil tried unsuccessfully to prevent Jesus from bringing forth the Kingdom of God, the Church. Mary and Joseph traveled eighty miles from Nazareth to Bethlehem when Mary was about to give birth. There was no room for them in the inn and Jesus was born in a stable. Herod tried to destroy Him by killing the Holy Innocents. Nevertheless, Mary and all His other disciples learned to live the way that Jesus showed us – loving God and our neighbor. We who are His disciples today struggle to follow their example as we remain in the world but not of it. Mary, our

Holy Queen, is enthroned in heaven above.

Psalm forty-five portrays Mary as Queen of Heaven and earth. She is Queen of earth because she is the only human being never to commit sin. Mary is Queen of Heaven because she is the Mother of God. "The queen stands at your right hand, arrayed in gold. The queen takes her place at your right hand in gold of Ophir. Hear, O daughter, and see; turn your ear, forget your people and your father's house. So shall the king desire your beauty; for he is your lord. They are borne in with gladness and joy; they enter the palace of the king. The queen stands at your right hand, arrayed in gold."

Now unlike Mary, we are all sinners. As St. Paul says in Romans 3: 23, "all have sinned and are deprived of the glory of God." Nonetheless, we can be saved through Christ's Sacrifice on Calvary if we repent of our sins. We are also brothers and sisters of Christ and children of God. Paul says in Romans 8: 16-17, "The Spirit itself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ, if only we suffer with him so that we may be glorified with him." Mary, our Holy Queen, is enthroned in heaven above.

In the second reading from the 1st Letter to the Corinthians, Paul talks about the glory to be revealed when we join our Lord Jesus Christ and His mother Mary in heaven. "Brothers and sisters: Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep. For since death came through man, the resurrection of the dead came also through man. For just as in Adam all die, so too in Christ shall all be brought to life, but each one in proper order: Christ the first fruits; then, at his coming, those who belong to Christ; then comes the end, when he hands over the kingdom to his God and Father, when he has destroyed every sovereignty and every authority and power. For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. The last enemy to be destroyed is death, for 'he subjected everything under his feet.' If we follow Jesus and Mother Mary, we too can conquer death and live forever, with God. Mary, our Holy Queen, is enthroned in heaven above."

Today's Gospel according to Luke focuses on the Visitation. Mary goes to visit her mother's cousin Elizabeth who is past the age of child-bearing and yet is with child by the mercy of God. "When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the infant leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth, filled with the Holy Spirit, cried out in a loud voice and said, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And how does this happen to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? For at the moment the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the infant in my womb leaped for joy. Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled." And Mary said: 'My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God my Savior for he has looked with favor on his lowly servant. From this day all generations will call me blessed: the Almighty has done great things for me and holy is his Name."

When Pope Pius XII proclaimed the doctrine of the Assumption on November 1, 1950, he wrote: "Hence, the august Mother of God, mysteriously united from all eternity with Jesus Christ in one and the same decree of predestination, immaculate in her conception, a virgin inviolate in her divine motherhood, the wholehearted companion of the divine Redeemer who won complete victory over sin and its consequences, gained at last the supreme crown of her privileges – to be preserved immune from the corruption of the tomb, and, like her Son, when death had been conquered, to be carried up body and soul to the exalted glory of heaven, there to sit in splendor at the right hand of her Son, the immortal King of the ages."

Church, total faith in God distinguishes Mary among all Christians. Her acceptance of God's plan made our salvation possible through the Birth, Life, Death, Resurrection, and Ascension of her Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. As we celebrate the reward Mary received for her faith-filled faithfulness, we grow closer to her and our Savior. Jesus and Mary are both waiting for us in our heavenly home, which we will reach if only we persevere in our faith.

Mary, our Holy Queen, is enthroned in heaven above. Amen. Amen.



On the **Solemnity of Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary**, we shift from Ordinary Time to the Season of the Resurrection with the first reading from the New Testament as is the normal during the Season of the Resurrection/Easter. Today we look at a day in the life of the Mother of God, "Theotokos," which means "God Bearer."

St. Augustine of Hippo, in one of his writings reminds us that none of us can be the Mother of God as Mary was, but all of us can strive to be like her, in perfecting our role as disciples. In the reflection, in Vol IV of the Liturgy of the Hours, we hear these words of St. Augustine on Tuesday of the 19th week of Ordinary Time: ***I tell you again and again, my brethren, that in the Lord's garden are to be found not only the roses of his martyrs. In it there are also are the lilies of the virgins, the ivy of wedded couples, and the violets of widows. On no account may any class of people despair, thinking that God has not called them.***

"Be perfect as your heavenly Father is perfect," we hear in Matthew 5:48. Following in the footsteps of Mary, who never wavered in following the **Way of the Cross**, is the way to perfection as disciples.

In addition to reading today's Gospel, I invite you to look at John 2:1-12, The Wedding at Cana. On the Solemnity of the Assumption, we as disciples are invited to **"Go into the neighborhood, and check out our assumptions."** As Mary did and as Jesus does, so should we.

GOD OF HOPE...*We come to you asking for restoration of national peace and unity for the common good of all people.*


GOD OF CREATION...*We ask that everyone be recognized as being created in God's image and thus be treated with respect and dignity.*





KDF Hardship Grant Program



THE AMOUNT OF AID FOR EACH FAMILY:
\$500 OR \$1,000

MAXIMUM 20 GRANTS PER MONTH

Application Conditions:

- The head of household must have an income under 150% of the federal poverty line and are experiencing economic hardship. Use our website to check for eligibility.
- Resides and works in the Virginia, Maryland, and/or DC area.
- Limit of one grant per family per year.

Application Process:

1. Apply now on the KDF website. Application periods start on the 16th of the month and go through the 15th of the next month.
2. Provide a letter explaining the hardship and the requested grant amount.
3. Provide the tax return (Form 1040) from the last year to show that your income is under the federal poverty line.
4. Provide proof of economic hardship due to loss of income source, medical, and/or natural disaster(s); this could be a letter of dismissal, medical bills, or other bills.
5. Provide an affidavit attesting the true facts of the application.
6. Provide two reference letters from persons/organizations who can attest for the applicant.

Notes:

- The KDF Hardship Grant program operates throughout the year
- The KDF Hardship Grant program offers rolling application periods where applications are accepted before the 15th day of a calendar month.
- The KDF will notify approved applicants by email/phone. Approved grants are provided by the last day of the month in which the application was reviewed.
