

SUNDAY GOSPEL REFLECTION

_____ *Luke 19:1-10*

In therapy, there is a phrase called 'stages of change' or the Transtheoretical model of change designed by James Prochaska, a clinical psychologist from Rhode Island in 1983. As he describes it, the human goes through a series of steps or phases prior to making any significant change in their lives. The stages of change are as follows: (1) pre-contemplation (no intention to change behavior in the foreseeable future), (2) contemplation (thinking about possibly making a change), (3) preparation (there is intention to take action and some steps have been taken), (4) action (behavior has been changed for a short period of time), (5) maintenance (behavior has been changed and continues to be maintained for the long term and (6) termination (there is no desire to return to the prior negative behaviors).

What stage do you believe Zacchaeus was in when he decided to see Jesus? He had heard about him and wanted to 'see' him so because he was a small man in stature, he ran ahead of the crowd to climb a tree so he could get a good look. He had no idea what he was about to encounter and how his life would change forever when he came into the presence of the Lord.

Jesus saw him in the tree and told him to come down that he wanted to dine with Zacchaeus in his home that very evening. Immediately, Zacchaeus began taking action to undo the injustices he had previously done. He was willing to give half of his belongings to the poor and if he had cheated anyone, he was willing to pay back four times as much!

Zacchaeus skipped steps 1 – 3 of the 'stages of change' and went immediately to step 4 which was taking real, concrete action. When the presence of the Lord is with us, He will assist us in skipping many levels in life while others look on and wonder and grumble as to how we did this or how we got that. Those who looked on as Jesus spoke to Zacchaeus grumbled 'this man has gone as a guest to the home of a sinner.' They too had no idea the plan of Jesus to move Zacchaeus from precontemplation straight to action as He entered his presence and into dialogue with him.

The presence of the Lord moves us through life if we listen and act as he speaks to our spirits. The **PRESENCE OF THE LORD IS HERE !**

GOD'S MERCY IS BIGGER THAN ANY MISTAKE THAT YOU'VE MADE.

HOMILY

Good Morning, St. Teresa. Today is the 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time. As you may or may not know, Deacon Tim was recently hospitalized, and we continue to keep him, and his family lifted up in prayer. We know that all creation is held in God's loving Hands, and He will bring about the best outcome for us all. Church, I am sure you are familiar with this song:

Your grace and mercy brought me through.
I'm living this moment because of You.
I want to thank You and praise You too.
Your grace and mercy brought me through.

So, my title today is God's grace and mercy will bring us through.

The first reading is from the Book of Wisdom. "Before the Lord, the whole universe is as a grain from a balance, or a drop of morning dew come down upon the earth. But you have mercy on all, because you can do all things; and you overlook people's sins that they may repent... Therefore, you rebuke offenders little by little, warn them and remind them of the sins they are committing, that they may abandon their wickedness and believe in you, O Lord!"

Church, we are all familiar with the story of Jonah and the whale. God told Jonah to preach repentance to the Ninevites, the traditional enemies of Israel, who were living in a sinful manner. Jonah didn't want them to be forgiven so he tried to run away from the task that God had given him. He got punished by spending three days in the belly of the whale and then he followed God's command. The Ninevites repented and were forgiven just as Jonah had feared. Church, we always want God to forgive us our sins, but we don't really want Him to forgive the sins of our enemies. But God wants all of us to be saved, even our enemies.

Jesus made this clear in the Our Father when He taught us to say, "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." God's grace and mercy will bring us through.

The Responsorial is from Psalm 145. "***I will praise your name for ever, my king and my God... The Lord is good to all and compassionate toward all his works... The Lord lifts up all who are falling and raises up all who are bowed down.***" Church, if you really want to see how hard it can be to forgive someone, just get cheated. I hate to say it, but people seem to be on their worst behavior after somebody dies.

When my mother's stepmother passed, her relatives swooped down on my grandfather's house like so many vultures and picked over her furniture. And we all know about circumstances where one heir cheated the others. My closest friend has said to me that the advantage of being an only child is not having to fight with siblings over the estate. If you don't want your children to fight over who gets what after you pass, you better make a will and give everybody a copy. God's grace and mercy will bring us through.

Today's Gospel is from St. Luke. "***Now a man there named Zacchaeus, who was a chief tax collector and also a wealthy man, was seeking to see who Jesus was; but he could not see him because of the crowd, for he was short in stature... When he reached the place, Jesus looked up and said, 'Zacchaeus, come down quickly, for today I must stay at your house...' But Zacchaeus stood there and said to the Lord, 'Behold, half of my possessions, Lord, I shall give to the poor, and if I have extorted anything from anyone I shall repay it four times over.'*** And Jesus said to him, '***Today salvation has come to this house... For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save what was lost.***'"

Church, tax collectors were hated by the Jewish people for two reasons. First, they collected taxes for the Roman occupiers and, second, they cheated those paying the taxes by overcharging them. So, you can see why they were ostracized from the Temple and Jewish society. But Zacchaeus wants the Mercy of God just like we do. So, he sought forgiveness and promised to make recompense for his sins. None of the bystanders wanted Jesus to forgive Him. But God is not going to punish any of us, no matter how grievous our sins, if we repent.



In his prayer for the Jubilee Year of Mercy from the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception on December 8, 2015 to the last Sunday of the Church year, the Solemnity of Christ the King on November 20, 2016, Pope Francis said: ***“Lord Jesus Christ, you have taught us to be merciful like the heavenly Father and have told us that whoever sees you sees Him. Show your face and we will be saved. Your loving gaze freed Zacchaeus and Matthew from being enslaved by money; the adulteress and Magdalene from seeking happiness only in created things; made Peter weep after his betrayal, and assured Paradise to the repentant thief.”*** Church, God’s grace, and mercy will bring us through.

When we have sinned, we can seek God’s forgiveness through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. This sacrament is a wonderful gift. Not only do we receive forgiveness for our sins when Christ, acting through the person of the priest, gives us absolution but we can be assured that the priest will never tell anyone, under any circumstances, what we confessed. The seal of Confession binds the priest under pain of excommunication.

He cannot even go to court and admit that he heard your confession. In the old days, when I was young, we used to go to Confession every Saturday afternoon. I used to really hate Saturdays for that very reason.

As I now go monthly to Confession with my spiritual director, I have come to understand that it was my pride that kept me from wanting to admit, even to God, that I was not perfect. Also, I didn’t want to face up to my sinfulness.


Well, just like the first step in Alcoholics Anonymous is to admit that one is an alcoholic, the first step in getting on the road to a more Christian life is to admit that one is a sinner. While I’m not proud to admit it, Church, I am a sinner. The only hope I have for redemption is the love and mercy of God.

Our problems in this life stem from things we foolishly do to ourselves and things that God allows to happen to us. We are always asking why bad things happen to good people, in general. And in particular, why do bad things happen to me? All religions and philosophies grapple with these questions. Christianity has the answer. Matthew 7: 25 and 27 says that the rains fall, the winds blow and buffet all our houses. That is just the way of this imperfect world. But those who not only listen to the words of Jesus, but also act on them, have built their houses on solid rock and no matter what happens, their houses will not collapse. As St. Paul says in Romans 8: 38-39, ***“For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor present things, nor future things, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.”***
