Home Improvements:

Insurance Status on School building: Since all building project are on hold until the close of the **Seek the City** Process, Fr. Paul has asked the archdiocese to change the assessment for the insurance on the school building. Currently we are insured to replace and Fr. Paul has changed the status to demolition. This simply means if a fire or any other catastrophic damage would be done to the school the insurance company would only provide for the demolition of the building. This change will save the parish \$17,000.00 a year in insurance. This change takes effect August 1st.

- Thanks to your generosity Fr. Paul was able to install new flooring in the hallway outside the St. Augustine Room. \$850.00)
- Did you notice the new lighting in the sanctu ary? Two spotlights we installed in the church to brighten up the sanctuary. (\$1,500.00)
 - Fr. Paul is looking into renovating the St. Augustine room with new wall paper, flooring and ceiling fans. Looking for a reasonable estimate. The St. Augustine Room is the only gathering space we have at this time and other than replacing the carpet every few years and a little painting nothing has been done.
- Another project down the pike is the side doors of the church going into the school parking lot. Those door are in need of replacement or some type of improvement.


