Moses spoke to all the people, saying:

"A prophet like me will the LORD, your God, raise up for you from among your own kin; to him you shall listen.

This is exactly what you requested of the LORD, your God, at Horeb on the day of the assembly, when you said, 'Let us not again hear the voice of the LORD, our God, nor see this great fire any more, lest we die.' And the LORD said to me, 'This was well said. I will raise up for them a prophet like you from among their kin, and will put my words into his mouth; he shall tell them all that I command him. Whoever will not listen to my words which he speaks in my name, I myself will make him answer for it. But if a prophet presumes to speak in my name an oracle that I have not commanded him to speak, or speaks in the name of other gods, he shall die."



The next few months are a time of prayer and discernment, where all Pastors & Parish Leaders will be called to reflect on the feedback and weigh in to help develop the first new model for our City Church.

A Citywide Mass at the Basilica (Thursday, Feb 1st) followed by Lenten Pilgrimage Journeys beginning Wed., Feb. 21st then each Wednesday during Lent [7:00pm – 8:30pm] Locations: The Basilica, St. Bernadine's, Sacred Heart of Jesus, Cathedral of Mary Our Queen)

In April & May the first Draft models will be shared with leadership and parishioners for feedback and comment, and then shared openly through regional town halls for public comment.

Draft recommendations will be presented to the Archbishop and Final models will be presented at the end of June, 2024.
