



Pastor's Corner Last week, Kevin Klonowski, a lifelong member of St Charles Parish, was officially called to ordination by Bishop Lennon in an Admission to Candidacy Ceremony at St Mary Seminary. I was privileged to attend that ceremony, along with Kevin's family. Kevin is on schedule to be ordained a deacon in October with ordination to the priesthood and then a First Mass at St Charles in May of 2016.

Speaking of vocations, one of the priestly responsibilities that I particularly enjoy is serving as a field education supervisor for seminarians assigned to the parish. I was first asked to do this work in 1981. For thirty-four years, it has been my privilege to minister with a number of outstanding young men on their way to the priesthood. St Charles Parish has benefitted as well from the seminarians' time with us. I remain in contact with those who were ordained, many of whom are now pastors! They serve the Diocese of Cleveland faithfully and honorably.

Seminarians in their third year of theology studies at Cleveland St Mary Seminary are expected to spend eight months in a parish. This is called their internship year. From September of 2015 until the end of April 2016, we will host Matthew Cortnick for his year of internship. Matt is from St John Vianney Parish in Mentor. I have asked three couples from the parish to serve as a Laity Formation Board for Matt: Adam & Melissa Gecewich, Tom & Linda Michalakes, Rich & Diane Liptak. That Board will give Matt honest feedback on his ministry here and they will also report their observations and opinions to the Seminary officials.

You will hear more about Matthew Cortnick—and what he will be doing—as the day of his September arrival draws near.

Today is **Polish Constitution Day**. There will be a daylong celebration here in Parma's "Polish Village." The festivities begin with our Sunday 10:30am Mass. Father Gary Chmura--born, raised, and educated at St John Cantius Parish in the Tremont area--will be our celebrant and homilist.

Another Word from Father Carlin:

The Second Vatican Council, held from 1962 to 1965, called for a restoration of the permanent diaconate. Prior to the Council-for many centuries--the order of deacon had been one step on the road to the priesthood. The Second Vatican Council called for a return to the early practice of the Church: the diaconate would stand as a separate order and it would be open to married men.

Each diocese introduced the permanent diaconate in its own way. Some dioceses quickly ordained dozens of deacons; other dioceses proceeded at a slower rate. The first deacon in Cleveland was an African-American, Joseph Newman, around 1970.

The Cleveland Permanent Diaconate Program was established in the early 1970's. When I was in the seminary, those studying for the diaconate took classes on Wednesday evenings and on Saturday mornings. After three years of training and education, the Diocese began ordaining--about six deacons per year. A few years back, Bishop Lennon revamped the diaconate program and it now calls for five years of study and formation.

So the "permanent diaconate," as we know it now, is less than fifty years old. That's not so long in a two thousand year old Church! It is fair to say that today's permanent deacons are true pioneers. They are staking out new territory in the Church; who knows what they will eventually be called upon to do

Deacons are ordained, just like priests and bishops. By virtue of their office, deacons can preach, assist at the altar, perform baptisms, and witness marriages. Beyond that, a deacon's ministry is what he makes of it. In the Cleveland Diocese, there are deacons who are chaplains, who serve in prisons, and some run large social service organizations. Permanent deacons come from all walks of life: business men, police officers, construction workers—with both blue collar and white collar backgrounds.

At St Charles, we have been blessed for thirty-two years with the diaconal ministry of John Talerico. Deacon John's "day job" is serving as a surgical assistant. He is a family man: a husband, father, and grandfather. He is frequently seen at the Sunday 12:00Noon Mass. Deacon John also conducts our Pre-baptism parent class on the first Wednesday of the month. He is available for all major liturgical ceremonies, baptizes on the regular schedule, and preaches when called upon. He brings a unique vision—given his background—to his diaconal work. We are all richer because of him.

Dan Galla also serves us as a permanent deacon. He and his classmates will celebrate the tenth anniversary of their ordination this Tuesday, May 5, with a 7:00pm Mass at St Basil the Great Church on Route 21 in Brecksville. Deacon Dan is a married man. His "regular job?" He is a theology teacher at St Ignatius High School. Deacon Dan is most often seen at the Sunday 9:00am Mass. He also works closely with the RCIA program. Like Deacon John, he is called upon for marriage, to preach, and to baptize. Deacon Dan also has some diocesan responsibilities.






