This is Mission Sunday at St Charles; we welcome Elise Frederick, Executive Director of Mission Doctors Association (MDA). MDA, founded in 1959, sponsors Catholic Doctors and their families as they share their gifs and talents at mission hospitals in Africa, Asia, Latin

The annual visit from a missionary reminds us that the Church is more than just our own parish, or the Diocese of Cleveland, or even our country. We have brothers and sisters all over the world. And we help, not because they are Catholic, but because we are Catholic.

There will be a second collection at Mass today for the Mission Doctors Association.

Frontotemporal Degeneration (FTD) is a disease that attacks the nerve cells of the brain's frontal and temporal lobes; the lobes then deteriorate and shrink. FTD impedes the ability to plan and organize activities and sometimes affects behavior in social and work settings. Communication and relational skills are also affected. Short and long term memory may remain. Dave Kelly, long-time leader of the St Charles folk guitar group was diagnosed with FTD in April 2017 and he received a second diagnosis of Lou Gehrig's Disease last month. Dave is now unable to continue his work with us. FTD is the same illness that required Bishop Lennon's resignation in December of 2016.

Dave's many St Charles friends are sponsoring an Italian Dinner on Saturday, September 29, in the Corrigan Gym, following the 4:00pm Mass: dinner to be served at 5:30pm. Proceeds of this dinner will be donated to the Association for Frontotemporal Degeneration to support the quality of life for those affected by FTD and to assist with research to find a cure.

The dinner menu includes chicken parmigiana, pasta, salad, rolls, cake, and beverage. Cost is \$9.50 and tickets are available at the Parish Office. This promises to be a great meal for a very good cause. Plan on having dinner here on the last Saturday of September and spread the word to friends and family.








You Are Joyfully Gifted

Did you know that you are joyfully gifted?

God has given each one of us at least one spiritual gift, also known as a charism at Baptism.

Pope Benedict XVI in Charity and Truth, "The human being is made for gift...Gift by its nature is that of superabundance. It takes first place in our souls as a sign of God's presence in us, a sign of what he expects from us."

What is a charism?

A charism is a spiritual gift given by God to be used at the service of others.

Using one's spiritual gifts brings life to the owner and life to the faith community.

How do I know my charisms?

Some ways to recognize one's giftedness is by looking for clues.

Yearning: when a person possesses a charism, they are naturally or supernaturally drawn to activities using them.

Rapid Learning: a person learns activities related to spiritual gifts quickly.

Flow: when a person is using their charism, the activity is performed with great ease.

Glimpses of Excellence: a person upon completion of using the charism sometimes might say, "how did I do that?"

Satisfaction: one never tires of using the charism and is anxious for the opportunity to use it again.

Pope Francis encourages us to use our charisms in Joy of the Gospel, "Our charisms are not an inheritance, safely secured and entrusted to a small group for safekeeping; rather they are gifts of the Spirit integrated into the body of the Church, drawn to the center which is Christ and then channeled into an evangelizing impulse."

Our charisms are to be discovered, discerned and used to build the Kingdom.
