The month of September brings two new personalities to the St Charles Pastoral Staff: Cindy Zalek and Scott Swinerton. Let me tell you a bit more about both of them, plus provide some helpful background information.

"Good Pope John" (a great favorite of mine) now Pope St John XXIII, called for a Council of the Church shortly after his election as Pope in 1958. Known as the Second Vatican Council, it met in four sessions of four months each, September to December, for four years, 1962-1965.

The Council called for updating and new directions. Overall, the Council emphasized our call to holiness. The Council also challenged the Church to adopt new ways of ministry. Prior to the Council, parish work belonged primarily to the parish priest. The Council reminded us that we are all called, by reason of Baptism, to the service of the Church. Pastoral Ministry can be exercised by all who are baptized.

St Charles has been blessed in the last seven years with the dedicated work of our pastoral associate, Brian Pelcin. Joining Brian as a pastoral associate this Monday, September 16, will be Cindy Zalek. Cindy brings many gifts to this ministry. Cindy has just left a responsible executive position with the American Red Cross. A long-time parishioner of St Charles, Cindy has served as a lector, a Eucharistic Minister, a teacher, and as coordinator of our parish "Catholics Returning Home" program.

Cindy brings a great deal of academic preparation to her new role. A graduate of Ursuline College, Cindy then attended Cleveland State University and completed a Master's program in Public Administration. Cindy also enrolled at our diocesan seminary, St Mary's, and there earned a Master's degree in theology. (The same degree required for priesthood.) Cindy then registered in the Cleveland Diocesan Lay Pastoral Ministry Program and was awarded full certification from the Bishop.

More importantly, **Cindy** brings competence, dedication, and many people skills to her new position. Initially, I am asking **Cindy** to work with our various parish groups and organizations, in addition to the regular expectations of wakes, communion calls, office visits, meetings, etc.

Please make **Cindy Zalek** welcome as she assumes her duties as a St Charles Parish pastoral associate.

I particularly enjoy serving as a Field Education Supervisor for St Mary Seminary. This year we welcome as a seminarian intern Scott Swinerton. Scott is from St. Mary of the Falls Parish in Olmsted Falls. He has completed two years of theological studies and he will be with us for "on the job" training from this September until next April. Scott, and his classmates (assigned to other parishes), began their internship last Saturday. Scott will be involved in all areas of parish life and must complete a major "parish project." I have asked a Lay Formation Board to work with Scott and to give him honest feedback on his ministry here. Thank you to those who agreed to serve: Jeff & Karen Borsz, Jon & Julia Hauserman, Scott & Dolores Rukavina, and Judy Lachvayder-Frazier. Welcome, Scott Swinerton!

Our Peanut Butter and Jelly Drive (plus sealable plastic sandwich bags) continues throughout September. Leave your peanut butter, jelly, and sandwich bags in the blue bins found in the church lobbies.

I will offer a four-week (Thursday evenings) DVD series entitled "EPIC: A Journey through Catholic Church History," beginning Thursday September 26 thru Thursday October 17. 




