This Sunday evening, October 31, is Halloween. The formal title is "All Hallows Eve" or the "Eve of All Saints Day." We have a big supply of "trick-or-treat" candy and it will be available at the Parish Office from 6:00 until 8:00pm this Sunday evening. COVID canceled Halloween 2020, but we are "ready for all the ghosts and goblins" this year! BOO! See you Sunday evening!

Monday, November 1, we celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints. Because November 1 falls on a Monday this year, there is no obligation to attend Mass. For those who wish to celebrate the day, there will be three All Saints Day Masses on Monday: 7:00, 8:30am and 7:00pm. (As well as Anointing of the Sick at the 7:00pm Mass, too!)

During the Church's liturgical year, more than half of the days are set aside to honor a particular saint. Over 2,000 years, those "formal" saints came from all walks of life and all parts of the world. They were "officially canonized," that is, recognized by the Church as saints. They stretch, in an unbroken line, back to the time of Jesus.

But All Saints Day recognizes those "everyday saints" who have touched our lives. We remember family members, friends, teachers, fellow parishioners and others who have lived a Christlike life. They may not be "officially canonized," but the holiness and goodness of their lives is known to us and we are sure that they now live with God forever. We are called to imitate them.

### All you saints of God! Pray for us!

Tuesday, November 2, is All Souls Day. At the 7:00pm Mass we will remember all from the parish who have been buried in the last year. Their names will be read at Mass. You are encouraged to enter the names of your beloved dead, from any year, in the Book of the Dead, found on the altar of the Holy Family Shrine in our church. The names in the Book of the Dead will be remembered at our Poor Souls Mass scheduled each month throughout 2022.

### May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace! AMEN!

Tuesday, November 2, is also Election Day. Pray that we will elect good local leaders who know the traditional values of our nation and who might inspire us, by word and example, to rise above the animosity and strife that recently has plagued our country's political life and discourse.

Wednesday, November 4, is St Charles Day, our parish patronal feast day. We will move our St Charles celebration to next weekend, November 6/7. Charles, while serving as Bishop of Milan in Italy, also dealt with a pandemic. Even in those medically primitive times, people were encouraged to take all reasonable precautions. Charles certainly has something to say to our generation and its challenges!


And don't forget: Turn your clocks and watches BACK one hour next Saturday, November 6, before you go to bed.

### Fr. Anthony's Word of the Week

In the daily reflections of the Breviary, I read a sermon by St Ambrose that reminded me of something so true. He is called the "Honey tongued doctor" for a reason! He said something to the effect: "Always pray for others first. God knows your needs." We can feel sometimes like if we don't ask for what we need, He won't do it. There is something to that. He wants us to ask, but He doesn't need to be told what we need. He already wants to give it. How receptive we are is our job. St Ambrose and so many other saints remind us that we are most receptive to God when we are looking to others' needs. He is loving us most when we are acting in His image and likeness, which is doing the good for the other. So when we pray for others, we are simultaneously offering Him our needs, and opening ourselves up to Him.

Pray for others first. Everyday there are people who have asked for our prayers, people we have promised to pray for, or people we are moved to pray for. These are our first priority. Then, pray for ourselves when we have time. Maybe someone we pray for isn't praying for themselves, so they need our prayers. If this is our habit, I think we will know when there is something we need to ask for ourselves, in our last petition. Yet, if we never thought to pray for our own needs, God already knows and will see to them as we see to others. I cannot help but share, in a far more powerful way, praying the Rosary is similar. We usually have some person or need on our mind when we pray the rosary, but Mary as Our Mother, already knows what we need. We don't have to pray every rosary for a singular intention for Mary to intercede. Instead, offer your rosary for Her intentions. She knows best and knows where graces are needed most. We please Her when we take all our needs and problems to Her and rest as we pray those prayers and enter into those mysteries of Her Son's life. It's letting Her take over. In return, She is far more generous in offering Her help to us. As I like to say, "Her prayers are best." Also, who will Jesus listen to more than His own Mother? For all of us prayer warriors/sinners, taking comfort that God knows all our needs, let's please Him by praying for others first.

### A REFLECTION FROM LUKE BROWN, LPCC

Serving Others (Part 3 of 3)

In the last two weeks, we have discussed the importance of serving others as a way to focus less on ourselves, as well as ways to maintain the delicate balance of serving others and taking care of ourselves at the same time. This week, I thought it might be useful to discuss serving and loving God, which is also mentioned in the Gospel this weekend. How do we love and serve God? When I reflect on serving God, it reminds me of how frequently we can forget the one-on-one intimacy that God is calling us to with Him. It is useful to imagine God like we would any relationship in our life. Imagine a friendship or spousal relationship in your life. Would it be loving to serve them by cleaning their home, washing their car, and serving them food, but then never sitting down to talk to them and spend time with them? On the other hand, would it be loving to spend time with them, getting to know them, but then be unwilling to do anything for them? The same is true in our relationship with God. We love and serve God by praying AND serving our fellow brothers and sisters. If we try to do one without the other, we have missed the point of today's Gospel. Praying and pursuing good boundaries helps us to maintain our spiritual life and mental health, while serving others helps us to get outside of ourselves and find compassion, peace, and joy in our service. Just like any loving relationship, God wants to know us and for us to know Him, and that only happens by taking the time to sit with Him. This week, consider reflecting on the call to love and serve God, as well as the call to one-on-one intimacy with Him like we do in our current daily loving relationships.




