There will be quite a few things happening around St Charles during the next two Lenten weeks.

On this Monday and Tuesday, March 14 and 15,

our own Father Josh Cochrac will offer our 2022 Parish Lenten Retreat. His topic is "He Did It for Me." Each evening's presentation will be at 7:30pm, immediately following the 7:00pm Mass, in church. See you at the Retreat!

"Begin Again" is a three hour, 5:00 till 8:00pm, offering of the Sacrament of Reconciliation (confessions) in all the churches of our Diocese. St Charles Parish will have four confessors available, for your service, from 5:00 till 8:00pm on this Wednesday, March 16. How long has it been since you made a good confession? This Wednesday is the perfect opportunity especially "if it has been a while."

And you are reminded that we also offer the Sacrament of Reconciliation after all Lenten weekend Masses (except the Sunday 5:30pm Mass).

St Charles is one of nine diocesan parishes offering "Nine Nights of Night Prayer" beginning Thursday, March 17, and concluding on Friday, March 25. This novena, or nine nights of prayer, is in anticipation of the Solemnity of the Annunciation. Prayer begins at 8:15pm. That prayer is taken from the Church's Liturgy of the Hours. It takes about fifteen

"Nine Nights" has been organized by the Diocesan Vicar of Evangelization, Father Damian Ference (a priest-son of St Charles Parish!) This is an opportunity to invite--not just the faithful--but also the non-practicing, the unchurched, and non-Catholics to pray together. So invite a friend! The Nine Nights concludes on Friday, March 25, with an Ice Cream Social in the Lower Parish Hall at 8:30pm. See you at the Novena!

Fr. Anthony's Word of the Week

I'm blessed and thankful to say we priests are fed homecooked dinner three times a week, by an amazing cook. Around 4 pm I'll be working away up in my room and I'll start to smell something happening. Smells of something delicious start flooding the house. Smelling dinner before you can eat it is both joyful and torturous at the same time! It makes me all the more hungry and I know I can't have it yet. I thought it's a little like sensing heaven from earth. We sense how good it will be, but we can't have it yet. The reality is both joyful and challenging. We can have so many sweet moments on earth to enjoy. We can have such moments of joy that we feel like we will burst. We can have moments of peace that we just want to stay there forever. We can have times in prayer and love that are so fulfilling that nothing else in the world matters. Yet the moment passes. It always passes. We have to go back to work. We have to move on. We head back out into the noise or the noise finds us. Too often the devil will do his best to snuff out the moment of joy or peace, so we might forget and get discouraged again. We have to cling to those heavenly moments and remember the consolations as we keep walking and working in faith. That's the point of faith. We haven't reached its full reward yet. We can taste or smell the fruits, but we have to wait for the feast.

There is something to this about Lent I think. It's a season when we choose to wait and not have what we desire. This shouldn't draw us farther away from heaven, but draw us closer towards heaven. When we fast from food and sweets, we come to enjoy them even more. Food never tastes so good than when you're hungry! Restraining ourselves from phones and television, we come to appreciate the minutes we have in our day even more. Being more mindful of our sins makes us more thankful for Jesus' mercy. Stepping away from things that distract us leads us deeper into prayer and the sweet silence we need. So Lent, a penitential season, can become a season of great thankfulness. We embrace little deaths of our own in honor of His death, knowing these deaths lead to the GREAT JOY of His Resurrection in our life. So while the Bridegroom is waiting, we will fast and pray, as Jesus said. May we fully embrace both the joyful moments He gives and the painful moments he allows until we live the full reality of His Resurrection. May we embrace the challenges of waiting in hope for the feast that our faith promises. In the meantime, there will always be moments and glimpses of heaven to savor here on earth. Supper isn't ready yet.



A REFLECTION FROM LUKE BROWN, LPCC

In the Gospel this weekend, we hear about the Transfiguration. I have always found Peter's words to be fruitful to reflect on because of his desire to remain in the presence of the Transfigured Christ, Moses, and Elijah. It reminds me of the very human desire to pause time when things are going well in our lives. We all probably have moments when things are peaceful, we are happy, and we feel like we are being flooded with God's grace. When I have those moments, I wish that I could remain in them forever! However, the Fall has guaranteed that we will not on this side of Heaven. To try and preserve these moments will ultimately fail and we will be disappointed. There will be good times and bad times, and that is perfectly OK. It is important to remember that if the moment has passed, it does not mean that God does not love you anymore or that you are necessarily doing something wrong. I think it can be tempting to think that because we do not feel good that something must be wrong or amiss in our relationship with Christ. Sometimes we feel bad because we have sinned in some way, but this is not always the case. Sometimes it is simply the result of our fallen world. This week consider praying with St. Peter and what it was like for him to be in that moment with Christ and then return to daily life.





How to Go to Confession...

May the Passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ, the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary and of all the saints,

whatever good you do and suffering you endure, heal your sins, help you grow in holiness, and reward you with eternal life.

Go in peace.

-Rite of Penance, no. 93

- 1 PREPARATION: Before going to confession, take some time to prepare. Begin with prayer, and reflect on your life since your last confession. How have you—in your thoughts, words, and actions—neglected to live Christ's commands to "love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind," and to "love your neighbor as yourself" (Mt 22:37, 39)? As a help with this "examination of conscience," you might review the Ten Commandments or the Beatitudes (Ex 20:2-17; Dt 5:6-21; Mt 5:3-10; or Lk 6:20-26).
- **GREETING:** The priest will welcome you; he may say a short blessing or read a Scripture passage.
- THE SIGN OF THE CROSS: Together, you and the priest will make the Sign of the Cross. You may then begin your confession with these or similar words: "Bless me, Father, for I have sinned. It has been [give days, months, or years] since my last confession."
- 4 CONFESSION: Confess all your sins to the priest. If you are unsure what to say, ask the priest for help. When you are finished, conclude with these or similar words: "I am sorry for these and all my sins."
- 5 PENANCE: The priest will propose an act of penance. The penance might be prayer, a work of mercy, or an act of charity. He might also counsel you on how to better live a Christian life.

6 ACT OF CONTRITION: After the priest has conferred your penance, pray an Act of Contrition, expressing sorrow for your sins and resolving to sin no more. A suggested Act of Contrition is:

My God,
I am sorry for my sins with all my heart.
In choosing to do wrong
and failing to do good,
I have sinned against you
whom I should love above all things.
I firmly intend, with your help,
to do penance,
to sin no more,
and to avoid whatever leads me to sin.
Our Savior Jesus Christ
suffered and died for us.
In his name, my God, have mercy.

(Rite of Penance, no. 45)

- **7** ABSOLUTION: The priest will extend his hands over your head and pronounce the words of absolution. You respond, "Amen."
- 8 PRAISE: The priest will usually praise the mercy of God and will invite you to do the same. For example, the priest may say, "Give thanks to the Lord for he is good." And your response would be, "His mercy endures for ever" (*Rite of Penance*, no. 47).
- 9 DISMISSAL: The priest will conclude the sacrament, often saying, "Go in peace."

If it has been a while since your last confession, remember, "Do not fear" (Is 41:10). The priest will help guide you. And feel free to take this how-to guide with you! (For more information, visit www.usccb.org/confession.)
