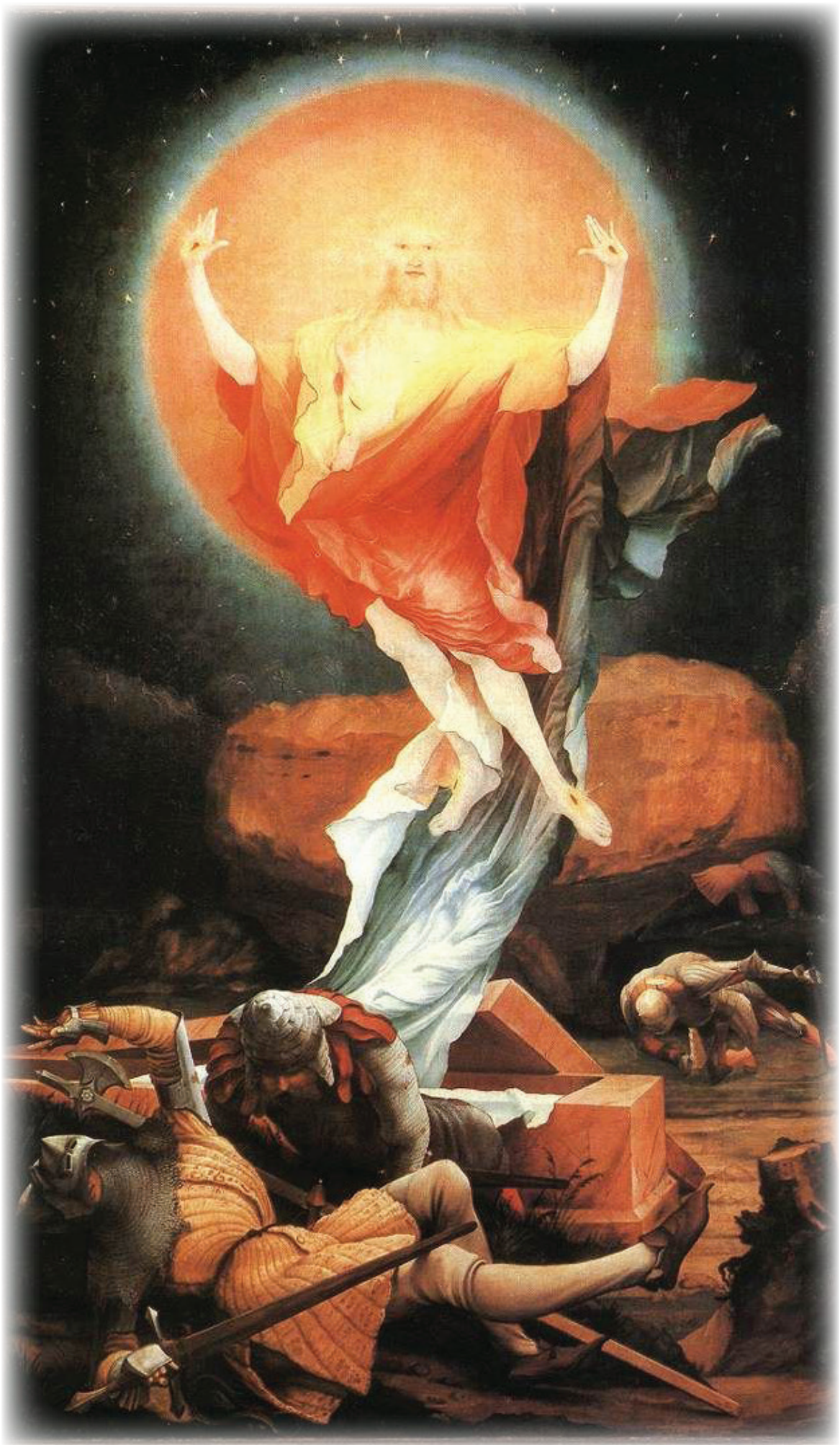

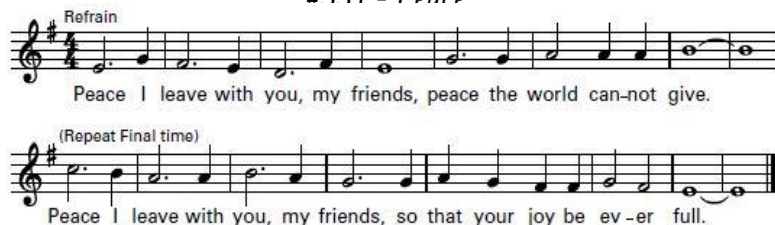

Today is the **Sixth Sunday of Easter**. Just like the schoolkids, I'm sure we are all anxious—as the song goes -- for “those lazy, hazy, crazy” days of summer.

One of the priestly tasks I particularly enjoy is serving as a field education supervisor for St. Mary Seminary. This involves working with seminarians in a parish setting as part of their preparation for the priesthood.

I was first asked to serve as a seminarian supervisor in 1980, when I was a young priest in my first assignment. When I began, I was only a few years older than the students. Now, I am older than the seminarians' parents!

Over the years, St. Charles has hosted seminarians in a variety of roles: for their one month live-ins before beginning theological studies, for one year internships, for weekend vocation programs, and for service as a deacon just prior to priesthood ordination.

A few of the seminarians I supervised determined that priesthood was not for them and they have gone on to live good lives as Catholic laity. Some others came to St. Charles, uncertain about a priestly commitment, but their time here convinced them that priesthood was the right choice for them.

Those who have gone on to ordination remain friends and still speak fondly of their “St. Charles Days.” All are good, holy, dedicated priests. Father Dave Woost, Father Steve Breck, Father Mike Stalla, Father Dave Blin, Father Paul Choo, Father Matt Cortnick, and Father Peter Bang all come to mind.

This year we have been asked to work with **Jon Hawkins** who has just completed his second year of theological studies at St. Mary Seminary. **Jon** will spend his internship summer with us. **Jon** is a member of Sacred Heart Parish, Wadsworth, in Medina County. His appointment to St. Charles is effective this Monday, May 23. I will ask **Jon** to introduce himself at Mass next weekend.

Jon will work with a Laity Formation Board composed of St. Charles parishioners. I have asked Rich and Linda Ciarrone, Paul and Melissa Koenig, Will O’Gorman, and Rosalie Zarzour to serve on that Board.

I learned of **Jon**’s appointment a few months ago. **Jon** and I have met and we have talked about his upcoming time with us. I enjoyed our discussion; he impresses me as a fine young man. We are blessed to have him with us.

Please make **Jon Hawkins** welcome at St. Charles!

Next **Sunday, May 29, after the 8:00 and 10:00am Masses**, our Parish Council invites you to attend the **May Donut Social** in the Lower Hall. Fresh donuts, coffee, tea, and juice. He is from St. Mary of the Falls Parish in Olmsted Falls and his first priestly assignment will be at St. Mary Parish in Hudson. Father Scott will join us this **Wednesday, May 25, at 7:00pm**.

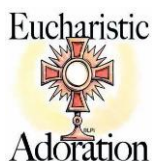


Fr. Anthony's Word of the Week

Conversion is turning or growing closer to God while also looking back in thankfulness for what's behind us. When I look back on scenes or memories of how I used to be, I'm amazed, even repulsed by the insecurities I used to have and the stupidities that came from them. The awkward, teeth-grinding, painfulness of our former ways: insecurities; ignorance; arrogance; pride; habits; failures; sinfulness; etc. are good reminders for us. They're not reminders to be ashamed of how we used to be or what we've done. They are reminders to be thankful for how far we've come, how we've grown, and how far He has brought us. I'm thankful for how I grew and learned through those times. Security in Him and freedom from ourselves can't be faked. It has to be learned, and growth involves growing pains. Essentially we celebrate His strength through our weakness; His grace through our sin. We die to ourselves and in faith, He makes us more alive.

The amazing and credible fact is we have an entire lifetime of continual conversion ahead of us. Whether our life is a hot mess right now or if we have thankfully sorted out much in our life, we will remain "special cases for Christ" and "works in progress" until His work is done in us and we're ready for Heaven. No matter how far we've come, we're never done moving forward. No matter how much work we still need, He is Lord and nothing is impossible for Him. May we look forward to looking back on the insecurities we haven't worked out yet, the sinfulness he still needs to work out, and the conversion that still lies ahead of us.

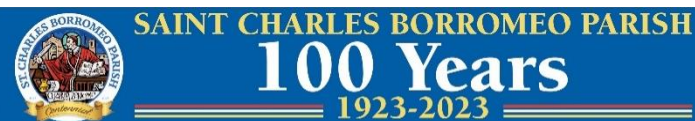

SACRED HEART COUNSELING

A REFLECTION FROM LUKE BROWN, LPCC

In my line of work, I have met many people who describe experiences of counseling that were not productive or helpful and that left the person thinking that counseling was a waste of time. Whether it is an individual, couple, or a parent bringing a child, some people leave with a bad experience that makes them want to write off the entire counseling field as unhelpful. I am not writing this to criticize those experiences or to place blame on people who were seeking help and found none. Counseling is a field full of diverse counselors that do not always hit the mark when people come to them seeking healing and guidance. We as counselors can have very different approaches to helping people and some are not the right fit for the person seeking help. It is worth mentioning as well that we are human and can have bad days where we feel burnt out, tired, or overwhelmed, which inevitably impacts our ability to be working at 100%. When people have had this experience, I often encourage them to give counseling another try. Finding the right counselor can be difficult, but it is possible. If you have a bad experience with a counselor, you have several options. You can give them a little bit more time, ask the counselor for a referral, or keep looking on your own for a different counselor. Websites like psychologytoday.com and catholictherapists.com can give you an idea of the counselor's approach to see if they are the right fit for you. Counseling can open many doors to healing and greater wellbeing. It is important to not let one bad experience prevent you from gaining all that counseling has to offer.

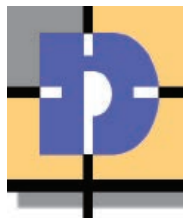
