

At this Sunday's 12:00 Noon Mass, the celebration of the First Scrutiny welcomes God's presence into the lives of the OCIA Elect. It acknowledges the power of grace over sin; that power which was so clearly evident for the Woman at the Well.

In your charity, please continue to pray for those who continue their journey toward full communion with the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil.



This is the Third Sunday of Lent.

Next Sunday, March 30 is a Fifth Sunday of the month. As we have done for many years, there will be a second collection at Mass next weekend for the St. Vincent de Paul Society of St. Charles Borromeo Parish. Our many SVdeP volunteers faithfully carry out the Corporal Works of Mercy – "feeding the hungry, caring for the lonely, and attending to the material needs of the less fortunate." Please help them do the Lord's work and assist, as you are able, with next week's Fifth Sunday SVdeP collection.

Our annual Parish Lenten Retreat begins this weekend. The Retreat Director, Greg Wasinski, will speak at this weekend's Masses and invite our participation in the Retreat. The actual Retreat presentations will be offered in our church this Sunday at 6:30pm, on Monday at 7:30pm (after the 7:00pm Mass), and on Tuesday at 7:30pm.

We average three to four funerals per week at St. Charles. At the time of death, we try to provide the best assistance we can; no matter who you were in life, you deserve a dignified send-off. In my forty-nine years as a priest, I have never said "no" to a funeral. If I have ever made a mistake, I will let the Good Lord sort it out. As Pope Francis once commented, "Who am I to judge?"

But what happens after the funeral? To assist those who have experienced a loss, we are launching a new ministry at St. Charles: "Grieving Together." This is not counseling; it is a confidential, safe space and time to be with others who are dealing with loss.

Those who have recently suffered a loss will receive an informative pamphlet you can review at your leisure. Our first meeting of "Grieving Together" will be on Thursday, April 3 at 7:00pm in the Borromeo Room (first floor) of the Parish Activity Center. Subsequent meetings will be on the first Thursday of the month.

I have asked Vida Lock, former director of the nursing program at Cleveland State University, trained in grief ministry, to coordinate this endeavor.

During March we are seeking candidates for our Parish Council. What does the job entail? Monthly meetings are held on the second Thursday from 7:00 till 8:30pm or so. We meet in the Rectory Basement Meeting Room. Since its founding thirty-six years ago, our Parish Council has been a most valuable resource for honest communication, new ideas, and helpful policies and programs. If you are eighteen or older, a member of the parish, and practicing your Catholic faith, you are eligible to run for a Council seat. There is a Parish Council Nomination Form in this bulletin. Complete it and return it to the Parish Office by the end of the month.

St. Charles Lenten Friday Fish Fry Number Four is this Friday, March 28, 4:00 till 7:00pm, in the Corrigan Gym. Baked or fried fish, shrimp, lots of side dishes, and Baker's Square pies—all at reasonable prices with quick and friendly service. Both dine-in and take-out services are available this year.

To help with your Lenten preparations, the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confessions) is offered after all our weekend Masses.

REFLECTIONS FROM GREG WASINSKI, MISSION PRESENTER

COUNSELING

A REFLECTION FROM LUKE BROWN, LPCC

We are almost halfway through Lent already! At the halfway point, I think it serves us well to revisit our Lenten commitments. I frequently hear Lenten practices compared to New Year's resolutions in that people sometimes want to quit if they fail at all in the process. New Year's resolutions are quickly abandoned after a slip-up because the entirety of the resolution is looked at as a failure. The same happens with Lent, and it is easy to give up if we look at it as a "failure" for not making it the whole forty days without a slip-up. The reality is that we will fail repeatedly in our efforts to be better, whether it is in trying to avoid sin or in praying more fervently. If we view things as total success or total failure, we will only ever get discouraged. When we view our spiritual endeavors, or any goals for that matter, in this black-and-white fashion, we will ultimately be left discouraged and despairing. Success essentially becomes unattainable. If success is unattainable, why even try? The reality is that our honest effort to be holier and sin less is success in and of itself. Our daily dedication to this mission is the success story, not the minutes prayed or sins committed. This does not give us an excuse to be lazy or to refrain from challenging ourselves, but it does give us the opportunity to see ourselves as more than simply successes and failures. This week, if you have found yourself discouraged by failure, consider reflecting on ways to rededicate yourself for the remainder of Lent!




