"The Spirit of the Lord is Upon Me"

The townsfolk of Nazareth were ready to acknowledge Jesus was a remarkable teacher who impressed them by "the eloquent words he spoke" (Luke 4:22), but their admiration stopped there. He was still Joseph's son, a carpenter who could make a yoke for their prized oxen or a table and chairs for their home. But they were not going to allow Jesus, the carpenter, to be their Messiah. As a result of their lack of faith, He performed no miracles in Nazareth. The people of Nazareth were indisposed to follow Jesus because of their superficial familiarity with Him as the poor carpenter and the son of Joseph. They were unable to accept Him as the Son of God. Who is Jesus to you? Is He the Son of Joseph? Is He a great teacher who impresses you with His extraordinary insights? Or is He the Son of God? This question demands a response which is life altering.

Take a Moment to Reflect on the Gospel:

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord."

We are all the Body of Christ!

How do we use our gifts and talents to live out the example of Jesus? How are we living this call of Missionary Discipleship? How is Jesus asking you to take care of the members of this Body of Christ?

Consider one of these activities to do as an individual or as a family:

Reach out to someone for whom you have prayed.
