"If you love me, you will keep my commandments. And I will ask the Father, and He will give you another Advocate to be with you always, the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot accept" ... John 14:15

Jesus assured his disciples it would be beneficial for Him to leave them. WHY? Because, when he did, he would send the "Advocate" to

them. We more commonly identify the "Advocate" as the "Holy Spirit," but the title Advocate, or Comforter in many translations, is a very descriptive term. The word *paraclete*, translated here as advocate, means 'called to one's side' and was used in court to refer to a counsel for the defense, an advocate. It is also used in the sense of someone who provides comfort. Most believers would love to have Jesus physically present with us throughout the day. However, Jesus tells us it is better for us to have the Holy Spirit in our lives than to have his physical presence. The Holy Spirit within gives us assurance of salvation (Eph. 1:13-14), leads us into the truth (John 16:13), equips us to serve (1 Cor. 12:7-11), and enables us to live the life God has called us to (Rom. 8:9-11). Without the Holy Spirit, we would be like Peter before Pentecost (John 18:17, 25-27). With the Holy Spirit we can be like Peter after Pentecost (Acts 4:13). We are called to "Get to know" our Paraclete/Advocate/Comforter. More than that? We must allow him to transform our lives.



Also known as Mothering Sunday, it naturally evolved into honoring your mother as well. And devotion to Mary, the mother of God and our spiritual mother, in the month of May gives this holiday depth for Catholics that goes far beyond giving flowers or candy on Mother's Day. In Catholic tradition, the month of May is dedicated to Mary. Chosen by God above all other women, Mary's faith and obedience paved the way for the Incarnation. Her example teaches us faith, obedience, humility and most of all, how to love. According to St. Thomas of Villanova, "If in this world any "person" ever loved God with whole heart, with whole soul, and with whole mind, she was the "person".

The Oil of Catechumens, also known as the Oil of

Exorcism, is the oil used in some traditional Christian churches during baptism; it is believed to strengthen the one being baptized to turn away from evil, temptation and sin. The Oil of Exorcism was mentioned in the ancient Christian Apostolic Tradition as being "used before baptisms to put to flight any conta-

gions that might obstruct the impending baptismal graces." The Egyptian Church Order teaches that it is blessed during the Easter Vigil, the first liturgy of Eastertide. The catechumen, the person prepared for baptism, is also anointed as a symbol of being the heir of the Kingdom of God, as kings and queens are anointed at coronations, and empowered for their Christian life as prophets were anointed for their ministry. The Oil of Catechumens is intended to help strengthen the person about to be baptized, and prepare them for the struggle (ascess) of the Christian life, the way a wrestler in ancient Greece and Rome was anointed before a wrestling match.

What is "Theology on Tap"?

Theology on Tap is an invitation for young adults to learn more about their faith and to share in the Catholic community. It is intended to serve as a springboard for other young adult initiatives. This program has proven to be a successful vehicle for reaching young adults interested in learning more about their faith, coming together to share community, and feeling welcomed and valued in the Catholic Church. "TOT has encouraged the Young Adults...to gather and discuss topics we are all facing in one way or another in a Godly way. This time together is important to support each other to keep God at the center of our lives!"
