John 20: 19-23 "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." John 20:23

Jesus passed through the locked doors of the house where the disciples were hiding. His arrival among them was a complete surprise. Did they

dread his reproaches, all but the beloved disciple, having abandoned him in His terrible hour of need? Before they can express any remorse, or make an excuse, He forgives them: 'Peace be with you'. Or, said another way: "be at peace".

It is an expression of unconditional love. We are called to give the same unconditional forgiveness to others in our own lives. Only when we believe ourselves to be forgiven, can we do the same. Is there someone I need to forgive this very day? In a gesture of wonderful intimacy, Jesus 'breathed' the Holy Spirit into his disciples. This act evokes God's promise to Ezekiel centuries earlier, to give us hearts of flesh instead of hearts of stone. If we refuse to believe ourselves forgiven, how can we forgive others?

Let us pray, in a special way, for the Church, spread throughout the world under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Let us ask for the grace to grow in love for the Church, which is the body of Christ himself, and of which we are a living part. It is through the Church we receive the Word, the Eucharist, forgiveness of sins and much, much more. The *Church* is the "**Bride of Christ.**" And yet it is full of sinners, like ourselves. Let us pray for the Church to be open to the Spirit, as it carries out Jesus' command to be his witnesses in today's world.

Pentecost? Why is it so important to us and the Church?

Pentecost marks the descent of the Holy Spirit, the third person of the Blessed Trinity, upon the Apostles and Mary, the Mother of our Lord Jesus Christ. This happens fifty days after Easter. Before the Ascension of Christ into heaven, He admonished His disciples to wait patiently for the Holy Spirit, who would come to energize and embolden them and also remind them of all the things He (Christ) had told them while on earth. Who is this Holy Spirit? He is known as the giver of life that proceeds from the Father (Nicene Creed). This life has its origin in the Father and is given to us through the Son. It is made our interior personal procession by the Holy Spirit.



Through Baptism the Holy Spirit enables us to be reborn as children of God and sharers of divine life. The Holy Spirit's descent upon the disciples is very symbolic because it marks the commencement of the Church, as it were. After the ascension of Christ into heaven, the disciples and other believers were afraid. Their leader was gone, and there was no one to protect them from their enemies. At Pentecost, while they were in the upper room praying, there was a loud noise and the Holy Spirit descended on each of them like tongues of fire and they began to speak in different languages to the astonishment of all. Now, armed with divine light, which enables us to know the Father, the once timid disciples began to proclaim the gospel with renewed vigor, accompanied by "signs and wonders."

Jesus calls the Holy Spirit the Paraclete, meaning 'he who is called to one's side or 'counselor'. His purpose is to teach Christians all things and bring them to a remembrance of everything Jesus said and did (Jn. 14, 26) Thus, the Holy Spirit is the personal presence of God's love dwelling in our hearts, producing fellowship with the Son and making us adopted children of the Father.

Memorial Day: Not just another Holiday

Celebrations similar to our modern Memorial Day might have started in ancient times.

One of the first Memorial Day celebrations in the United States was by newly freed enslaved men, women, and children on May 1, 1865, in Charleston, South Carolina.

The observance was originally known as Decoration Day.

It was Union General John A. Logan who called for an official nationwide day of remembrance on May 30, 1868, a date chosen because it wasn't the anniversary of a particular battle.

In 1950, Congress passed a resolution requesting the president issue a proclamation calling on Americans to observe Memorial Day as a day of prayer for permanent peace.

It is one of the few days flags are ordered to fly at half-staff then full-staff.
