16th Sunday in Ordinary Time - Matthew 13:24-43

The Parable of the Weeds and the Wheat A bit of botany is helpful in understanding this parable. Matthew uses the Greek term *zizania*, which in modern botanical terms refers to the genus of wild rice grasses. What Matthew most likely refers to, however, is darnel or cockle, a noxious weed which closely resembles wheat and is plentiful in Israel. The difference between darnel and real wheat is evident only when the plants mature and the ears appear. The ears of the real wheat are heavy and will droop, while the ears of the darnel stand up straight. We may find the dualism of this text troubling. It seems that there are two groups of people in the world — children of the kingdom and children of the evil one, wheat and weeds — and that their destinies are fixed from the beginning. Jesus says that at the end of the age, the angels will "collect out of his kingdom all causes of sin (*skandala*) and all evildoers, and will throw them into the furnace of fire" (13:41) Who among us has not questioned why God allows evil to grow

and thrive? Who among us has not wanted to take matters into our own hands and root out the evil in our midst? The master stops the slaves from doing anything of the sort. For one thing, it is not so easy to tell the weeds from the wheat, and for another, their roots are intertwined below the ground. Rooting out the weeds would uproot the wheat as well, doing more damage to the crop than leaving the weeds to grow.



Liturgical Ministries and Why They are Important.

All Liturgical celebrations, especially the celebration of the Eucharistic, are celebrations of the whole Church. They are not private functions. The Church is the "sacrament of unity: the holy people united and arranged under their bishops." Therefore, liturgical services pertain to the whole Body of the Church. In the midst of this Body, there are individual ministries which serve all the faithful by executing different functions. These functions are integral and necessary parts for the liturgy to be performed in a dignified and reverend manner. These ministries may include: Priest (Main Celebrant), Deacon, Altar Servers, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion,

Lectors, Ushers, and Music Ministers The Priest & Deacon are ordained ministers; the Priest is the single indispensable minister for the celebration of the Holy Eucharist. The Deacon, when present, has specific functions pertaining to his role in the celebration. Lay Liturgical Ministers exercise a "genuine liturgical function. They ought, therefore, to perform their roles with the sincere piety and decorum demanded by so exalted ministries and rightly expected of them by God's people" (USCCB).

July 22: St. Mary Magdalene

The Gospel of Luke, lists Mary Magdalene as one of the women who traveled with Jesus and helped support his ministry "out of their resources", indicating she was probably wealthy. The same passage also states seven demons had been driven out of her, a statement which is repeated from Mark 16. In all four gospels, Mary Magdalene was a witness to the crucifixion of Jesus and, in the Synoptic Gospels, she was also present at his burial. All four gospels identify her, either alone or as a member of a larger group of women which includes Jesus's mother, as the first to witness the empty tomb; and, either alone or a as a member of a group, as the first to witness Jesus's resurrection. For these reasons, Mary Magdalene is known in some Christian traditions as the "apostle to the apostles". Mary's closeness to Jesus results in tension with another disciple, Peter, due to her sex and Peter's envy of the special teachings given to her. It is widely accepted, among secular historians that, like Jesus, Mary Magdalene was a real historical figure. Nonetheless, very little is

known about her life. Unlike Paul the Apostle, Mary Magdalene left behind no known writings of her own. She was never mentioned in any of the Pauline epistles or in any of the general epistles. The earliest and most reliable sources about her life are the three Synoptic Gospels of Mark, Matthew, and Luke, which were all written during the first century AD . According to Gospel of Luke, Jesus exorcised "seven demons" from Mary Magdalene. The same story is repeated in Mark 16:9, part of the "longer ending" of that gospel. (NOTE: this is not found in the earliest manuscripts and is actually a second-century addition to the original text, possibly based on the Gospel of Luke. In the first century, demons were believed widely to cause physical and psychological illness. Bruce Chilton, a scholar of early Christianity, states the reference to the number of demons being "seven" may mean Mary had to undergo seven exorcisms, probably over a long period of time, due to the first six being partially or wholly unsuccessful.

Pope Francis names SoCal priests to become auxiliary bishops for the Archdiocese of Los Angeles

Msgr. Albert Bahhuth, Father Matthew Elshoff, Father Brian Nunes and Father Slawomir Szkredka were selected as auxiliary bishops of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles and their appointments were announced in Washington, D.C. at 3 a.m. by Cardinal-designate Christophe Pierre, Apostolic Nuncio to the United States. "This is a day of joy for the family of God in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles," Archbishop José H. Gomez said in a statement. "We give thanks to God, and we thank the Holy Father for this great blessing of new bishops. Each is a man of



prayer who loves Jesus and has a deep desire to share God's love and to serve God's people. We are praying for them, and we entrust them to the tender care of Holy Mary, our Blessed Mother." Archbishop Gomez officially presented the newly designed auxiliary bishops Tuesday morning at the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels downtown.


Did to know We have a Prayer and Petition Request Book???
