Without A Wedding Garment



"...he saw a man there not dressed in a wedding garment. The king said to him, 'My friend, how is it you came in here without a wedding garment?' But he was reduced to silence. Then the king said to his attendants, 'Bind his hands and feet, and cast him into the darkness

outside, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth.' Many are invited, but few are chosen."


The wedding garment is a test of loyalty to those who came to the marriage feast, and as a mode by which rebellion was avowed and loyalty made apparent. The "man" came to the gospel feast, and yet refused to comply with the command which related to the feast. He willfully preferred self to God, full of enmity and pride. He despised the gifts of grace, he scorned the rule of love, he stood a defiant rebel even at the banquet of mercy which his king had spread. His sin lay in coming at all without the wedding garment. If he did not mean to be of one heart with his fellow guests and his Lord, why did he come? If someone does not intend to yield to God's will, why does he profess to be of God's church? If we are not saved by the righteousness of Christ, why profess to be a believer in Christ? If we are not be obedient to Christ's holy will, why pretend to be a follower of Christ? It is a grave mistake for any person to imagine they can be in the church of God to their own advantage unless their heart is renewed; unless they mean what they declare and sincerely love the rule under which they profess.



Preparing for "Our Lady of Fatima"

The Lady of the Rosary does not give up asking the little shepherds to "pray the rosary every day". The reason for this is the key of the Message of Fatima: Fatima recalls the biblical character of a God with a merciful heart (Jer 4,19) who meets us, anxious to rescue us, and willing to provide fullness of joys. The prayer of the Rosary also focuses on the ultimate promise; the triumph of Mercy of the life of

Christ, evoked in the mysteries of the Rosary. Requested in all the apparitions of Our Lady – as we can tell by the first questioning to the seers –, the Rosary is the prayer learned in the school of Mary. It educates us through the humility of faith, according to the style of this unique Lady, with her "fiat"*, made of her own life a total gift, and treasured up all the gestures, every word of Jesus, "and pondered them in her heart" (Lk 2,19). To meditate on the mysteries of the life of Christ, in the way of Mary, is to allow ourselves to be shaped by the presence of God, like she did. Opening up with the doxology to the Most Holy Trinity – in other words, it becomes evident in the Rosary Christ's redeeming work is to place us in the horizon of the adoration to God. (*Latin for "let it be done".)

The Million Man March October 16, 1995

The Million Man March was a large gathering of African-American men in Washington, D.C., on October 16, 1995. Organized by Louis Farrakhan, it was held on and around the National Mall. The National African American Leadership Summit, a leading group of civil rights activists and the Nation of Islam working with scores of civil rights organizations, including many local chapters of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (but not the national NAACP) formed the Million Man March Organizing Committee. The founder of the National African American Leadership Summit, Benjamin Chavis Jr., served as National Director of the Million Man March.



The committee invited many prominent speakers to address the audience, and African American men from across the United States converged in Washington to "convey to the world a vastly different picture of the Black male"[1]: 152 and to unite in self-help and self-defense against economic and social ills plaguing the African American community. One of the primary motivating factors for the march was to place black issues back on the nation's political agenda. In the aftermath of the Republican Party's victory in the 1994 Congressional election and the continued success of the party's campaign platform, the Contract with America, some African American leaders felt the social and economic issues facing the black community fell by the wayside of policy debates.[2]: 243 March organizers believed that politicians were failing the black community by "papering over the most vital dimensions of the crisis in international capitalism"[2]: 243 and blaming urban blacks for "domestic economic woes that threatened to produce record deficits, massive unemployment, and uncontrolled inflation".

While a primary focus of those in ministry is on protecting children from harm, protecting vulnerable adults is just as important. This includes adults

living with mental, emotional, or physical disabilities, adults who have court-appointed guardians, elderly adults in vulnerable positions, and anyone else who may be unable to consent to or understand what is happening to them. Every year, nearly 500,000 reports of abuse against vulnerable adults are made to the Adult Protection Service, and even more go undetected. The same steps and processes outlined for protecting children can help vulnerable adults as well — know the warning signs, screen all employees and caregivers, and monitor environments for safe practices.
