Weekly Anointing and Prayer

After the 9:00AM Mass each Sunday, we will celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, for anyone who has the need to receive this sacrament. This is meant to include such concerns as upcoming diagnostic tests, limitations of aging, anxiety, depression, undue stress, addiction, etc. for all ages.

Please gather in the pews at the front of church and the priest will be with you approximately 10 minutes after Mass is over.

CELEBRATING THE HUMAN BODY...

The Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary is the oldest and greatest feast of Mary. Orthodox Christians call August 15th the Dormition (“the falling asleep”) of Mary.

“She who sheltered the Divine Word in her breast was to be lodged in the dwelling place of her Son,” says Saint John Damascene, describing his belief that after Mary’s death, her body was raised to live with God forever. That Mary’s body – not just her soul – is in God’s presence is a sign of the holiness of creation. The human body is not evil – it is good. Death is not the end of creation – it is the beginning of eternal life. In our day, when violence can desecrate the human body, the sign of Mary’s assumption gains new support.

The New Testament reading for this feast calls Jesus the firstfruits of those who have died, to be followed by the harvest of all who hope in him. As Mary, the model believer and sign of the Church, is gathered in, we hope that we too will one day be part of this harvest. We surround Mary’s statue at church and at home with brilliant clusters of flowers, herbs, and fruits – the firstfruits of the harvest of our gardens.

While this may be the oldest and grandest feast of the Blessed Mother, Mary, the feast was not considered a defined dogma or doctrine for us to accept and believe in until Pope Pius XII declared it thus infallibly on November 1, 1950 with the writing of a Papal Bull entitled *Munificentissimus Deus*.

This Saturday, August 15th, is the Feast of the Assumption of Mary. This year it is not a Holy Day of Obligation.

HOLY DAYS IN HISTORY...

Sunday is our original – and at first our only – holy day. As time went on, some churches began keeping other days holy, too: days to remember an event in the life of Christ or Mary, or the anniversary of the death of a saint.

In medieval Europe, these “feast days” were important. There was no such thing as a “weekend.” Every day – except Sunday – was a long and hard work day. A feast day meant that you only had to do the most necessary work. Then you could go to town for Mass, for socializing, playing, resting. It didn’t take long for feast days to multiply. Every so often the Church would have to cut back the number, or else folks would go four or five days without working! Feast days were possible because most everyone in a locale was Catholic.

When Spanish Catholics came to North America, they tended to create Catholic towns. Many Native Americans, too, lived in Catholic communities. To this day the pueblos of New Mexico still keep feast days with dancing and special foods. French Catholics, especially in Canada, kept alive some of their holy days. But Catholics from other countries lived in mixed communities with people of different religions. They could not close their stores because it was Ascension Thursday, or not help neighbors raise a barn on All Saints. Not until the great Catholic neighborhoods formed in the bigger cities of America could Catholics close up shop, go to morning Mass, and then spend the day feasting and relaxing – even on a week day!

Bishops began to designate certain holy days as “holy days of obligation.” Usually these were feast days that were already popular in a given community. The number of holy days that Catholics observed in the United States varied until 1885. Then, six days were set: January 1, Ascension Thursday (a different date each year), August 15th, November 1st, December 8th, and December 25th. Prior to this, how many and which holy days you kept depended on whether you lived in English, Spanish, or French America. For example, English-speaking American Catholics had 11 holy days of obligation from 1777 until 1885.

As our neighborhoods and parishes change, so do our rules about keeping holy days. In 1969, the bishops decided to transfer our solemn celebration of the Lord’s Epiphany from January 6th to the Sunday that falls nearest before that date. Epiphany is an important holy day, and yet the whole Catholic Community cannot count on having January 6th free. Recently, the bishops have voted to move our solemn celebrations of the Lord’s Ascension from a Thursday to a Sunday: the Seventh Sunday of Easter. This change should allow all of us to keep holy this feast day with Mass, recreation, and feasting, as we give thanks and praise for all that God does for us in Christ Jesus, our risen Lord.

Congratulations to our First Communicants as they receive their First Communion over the next couple of weekends.

ARCHDIOCESE OF ST. LOUIS
Office of Child and Youth Protection

The Archdiocese of St. Louis has developed a new system for safe environment compliance called Prevent and Protect STL. Everyone (clergy, employees and volunteers) ministering to minors and vulnerable adults in the Archdiocese are required to register in the new system before December 31, 2020. This includes those new to service as well as those who are currently compliant and in service. For those who have already attended a Protecting God's Children workshop, your previous training date will transfer to this new system. In addition to attending a live Protecting God's Children workshop, all clergy, volunteers and employees will register for an updated background screening, view two new on-line training modules on abuse reporting and the Code of Ethical Conduct, and agree to the updated Code of Ethical Conduct.

Please go to www.preventandprotectstl.org: select the 'register' link and enter 'stlprotect' for the passcode. Then create your username and password for this new system. WHY ISN'T EDUCATION THE GREAT EQUALIZER BETWEEN BLACKS AND WHITES?

- Education is critical for economic success in today's economy, but it actually exacerbates the racial wealth gap. The gap grows as educational attainment grows (so, the largest wealth gap is between whites and blacks with graduate degrees).
- How's that possible? First, the gap between white and black college graduates has doubled in the last 25 years, so whites are getting college degrees at much faster rates than blacks. So even if blacks and whites generated the same economic returns on their degrees, the wealth gap would grow.
- But they're not generating the same returns. Blacks generally have lower returns on their degrees because they are more likely to need student loans as well as larger student loans to finance their degrees. These loans then "displace" other kinds of building wealth, like buying a home or saving for retirement.

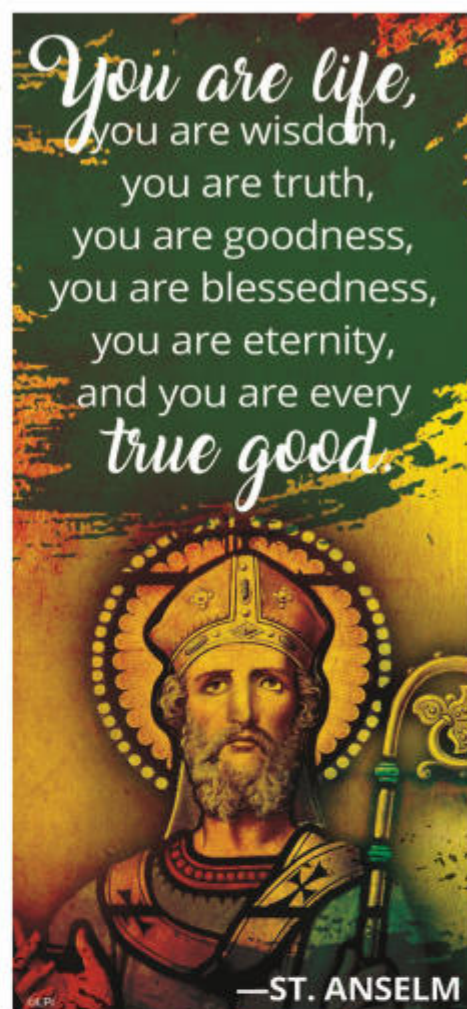

When in the presence of an environment that is silent, the worries, tribulations, struggles, and challenges of life seem to fade away, and we can experience a peaceful whisper. We can call that whisper God. Through the practice of contemplative prayer, we can find our way to that inner place of silence even in the midst of great distraction, busyness, and noise. The silence becomes one with us and grounds us. When we become friends with silence, friends with God, we can hear the gentle whisper of God's voice saying, "Come, stay here. Trust me and you will not fall."

Be still and know that I am God. Silence is sacred. Silence speaks the language of the soul and is the foundation of all life and eternity itself. Silence takes us beyond the limits of our minds and allows us to seek and to love the essence of all love, perfect love, and being. In silence, we can be non-verbally present to things and to God in ways that words cannot accomplish. We can discover, encounter, and be present to truths that our minds struggle to conceive and then set aside the boxes we put around things when comprehending them is challenging. We can know the unknowable and touch eternity when we encounter the core silence in our souls.

We can do this even on a noisy street and in the midst of the greatest distraction. Once we have made friends with silence, the rambling noise of the world no longer seems to matter, and we can carry a deep forgiving peace within us, even when physical silence cannot be found. We know that we are loved, cared for, sustained, nourished, embraced, and carried. There is nothing to fear in silence, and I can be present to myself in the same way that God is present to me. I can see myself as God sees me. All of my faults, weaknesses, imperfections, failings, and sinfulness melt away in the abundance of God's mercy. All of the worldly things we see as being important no longer are.

It is in silence that all of the barriers that divide us disappear. There is no more "yours" and "mine" but only the oneness of "ours." There is no longer a need to "figure things out," and we tap into our desire to simply let things be. Silence is creative and powerful and gives us hope. Silence is God's greatest blessing. God became one with humanity in silence. It allows us to be one with all of creation, with the moon and the stars and all of the creatures God has made. The smallest particle of creation radiates with beauty. Silence allows us to soar beyond ourselves and connect in ways that the mind can only imagine. When all is quiet, we begin to see that it is only our fear that keeps us from the Lord. It is our fear that causes us to sink and to fail. We can hear the gentle whisper that tells us to reach for God's hand. We discover that we yearn for the salvation and wholeness that only God can give to us. Be still my soul and be at peace.

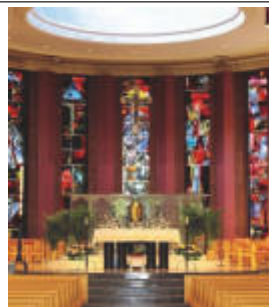

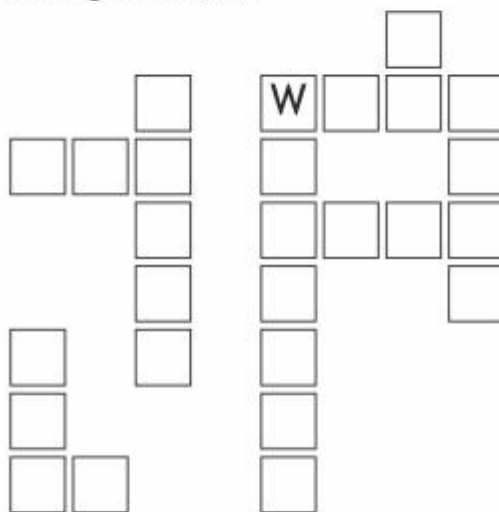
