The Church's Daily Prayer...The Liturgy of the Hours

The manner in which we begin and end each day becomes a lens through which we view the rest of the day. This is no contemporary wisdom. As long as human beings have been around to greet each new sunrise and pause in wonder at the setting of the sun, the need to mark the day's beginning and end has been in our bones.

The Church, too, acknowledges the natural rhythms of the day by inviting us to share in the prayer called the *Liturgy of the Hours*. In recent centuries, the Liturgy of the Hours was commonly understood to be the domain of priests and nuns. Readers over fifty may recall their parish priests and religious praying what was then called the Divine Office from the book called a breviary. As a result of the Second Vatican Council, the Liturgy of the Hours has been restored to its proper place as in integral part of the Church's public prayer for all who have been baptized.

For most of us, the Sunday Eucharist is our primary gathering for prayer each week. The Liturgy of the Hours invites us to pause during the course of each day, especially at morning and evening, to offer prayers of praise and petition to the God whose loving care permeates our days. Again, readers may recall praying the morning offering or the angelus, traditional prayers that were closely connected to particular times of the day.

In the Liturgy of the Hours, Morning Prayer calls us to offer praise and thanks to God for the wonders of creation and the great mystery of the resurrection. With psalms and hymns and a short reading from the scriptures, we acknowledge our dependence upon God's mercy and seek God's blessing on the day ahead. We might bless ourselves with holy water at Morning Prayer. We seal our prayer with the Lord's Pray and the sign of peace. At Evening Prayer (also called vespers), the Church gives thanks for the day's joys and sorrows and begs for God's continuing protection. We might begin with a service of candle lighting. We might also burn incense and sing Psalm 141: "My prayers rise like incense." We seal our prayer with the Lord's Prayer and the sign of peace.

Ideally, Morning and Evening Prayer are celebrated in common, but individual are encouraged to mark the beginning and end of each day with prayer even if they cannot gather with others. At its heart, the Liturgy of the Hours calls us to a simple and repeated pattern of prayer, prayer that readily springs to our lips because it is already rooted deep in our hearts.

Saints of the Month...St. Andrew Dung-Lac and Companions

Andrew Dung-Lac was a Vietnamese-born priest who, along with more than 100 Christians, was martyred for his faith during a time of religious persecution in 19th century Vietnam. Catholicism had been introduced into Vietnam by Jesuit missionaries; they had opened a permanent mission in Da Nang as early as 1615. Andrew was the son of Buddhist parents who allowed him to be instructed in the Catholic Faith.

It was dangerous to be a Christian at that time, but that did not stop Andrew from working as a catechist, teaching others about the faith. Eventually he decided to become a priest; Andrew was nearly 40 years old when he was ordained. During one of the many persecutions, Andrew was arrested. His parishioners collected the money needed to free him. Not long after, a law was passed requiring all citizens to help in the building of temples and to participate in ancestor worship. Many Christians, Andrew among them, refused to obey the new law. Andrew was arrested once again. He was beheaded in 1839 because he would not renounce his Catholic Faith. In the years between 1820 and 1862, 8 bishops, 50 priests and 59 lay persons were put to death because of their belief in Jesus. This group included French, Spanish, and Vietnamese missionaries.

Pope John Paul II recognized the powerful witness of these Christian martyrs when he canonized them in June 1988 in Rome. Because of their courage, the Church in Vietnam continues to spread the good news of the gospel in our own day. We remember Andrew Dung-Lac and his companions on November 24th each year.

Happy Thanksgiving everyone! Even with Covid rampaging the country we still are blessed in our country with so much good. Let us especially express our gratitude to all the health care workers and EMT folks who risk their lives daily to minister to our needs. And how about our teachers in our schools especially at St. Peter Grade School and the Kirkwood Schools who head to the classrooms everyday teaching our wonderful young people let's remember to give thanks this Thanksgiving day for all of them.

Enjoy this traditional feast with your family this Thursday and, of course, remember to give thanks to our heavenly God who is so present to us and cares so much for us in so many ways. Peace be with you all and I'll see you in church...or livestream.
