O Felix Culpa

She stared at me with quiet curiosity. I stood at the front of the classroom describing my ordination to the priesthood which happened just months before. All the fourth graders gave me their polite attention, but there was something about me that was puzzling this one girl. I finished my presentation. "OK, are there any questions?"

Her hand went up immediately. "You don't talk funny. You sound a lot like us."

That was an odd observation, I thought. She proceeded with her question. "Do you love your family?" she asked.

"Sure!" I answered. "They're very important to me."

"Do you miss home?" she followed up.

"Well, I guess so. But I haven't lived at home for a long time."

There was a sad look on her face, so I assured her, "I still see them."

This was 1995. Facebook, Skype, Zoom – all those media platforms for electronic exchanges hadn't yet been conceived. So the little girl asked, "When was the last time you saw them?"

"This past weekend," I said. "I usually see some of them at home every weekend."

Her eyes bugged wide and her mouth dropped open. "You travel all that way each weekend?!"

I started to get suspicious about this little girl's presumptions about me: the lack of an accent, the distance from my home. I asked her, "Where do you think I'm from?"

"Well, you're from Ireland, aren't you?"

I laughed out loud. "No! I'm from south St. Louis!"

Evidently rumors had been circulating at this parish to which I had just been assigned. They heard a


'Fr. O'Toole' with red hair was coming. "He must be from Ireland," they no doubt surmised.

So for the record – and by way of introduction – I'm Father Matt O'Toole, *not* from Ireland. I am very much a born-and-bred City of St. Louis kid.

I am — what some diocesan priests call — a "lifer." That means I went through the full twelve year run of the three seminaries of the Archdiocese. After finishing grade school at St. Joan of Arc, I entered the high school seminary, St. Louis Preparatory Seminary South. Next, I attended Cardinal Glennon College completing my undergraduate studies at St. Louis University where I earned two undergraduate degrees in philosophy and history. Then it was on to Kenrick Seminary where I earned my graduate degrees in theology. In the summers, I was a student at the Catholic University of America in Washington, DC, where I completed an M.A. in modern European history. Finally, I was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese by Cardinal Justin Rigali in 1995.

I served as an assistant pastor at St. Joseph in Manchester (1995-96) and St. Raphael the Archangel in St. Louis Hills (1996-2001). For the next ten years I was the chaplain and teacher at Christian Brothers College High School. During that time I resided and assisted at Our Lady of Lourdes in University City (2001-2008) and Ascension in Chesterfield (2008-2011). I now come to St. Peter after serving ten wonderful years as pastor at St. Margaret of Scotland in the Shaw neighborhood of south St. Louis.

I know that you have your own story as well. St. Peter parish and the city of Kirkwood are both rich in history, and I look forward to learning more about you both. Like that little girl in fourth grade whose innocent presumptions of me improved with the exchange of our conversation, so I look forward to knowing better the people of St. Peter Parish!

Monday, July 5th, Mass will be celebrated at 8:15am only.

In observance of Independence Day all parish offices will be closed Monday, July 5th.

Along with Archbishop Rozanski, we invite all of you to gather together again to experience the Eucharist—the true presence of the Body of Christ—in its fullest form.

On July 1, 2021, Archbishop Mitchell Rozanski lifted the dispensation of the obligation to attend Sunday Mass for all of the faithful in the Archdiocese of St. Louis. Based on the guidance of the Archdiocese of St. Louis, St. Louis County and the CDC, the following Mass protocols are currently being implemented:

- If you are fully vaccinated, you will not be required to wear a mask. Anyone not fully vaccinated, including children under 12, should wear a mask.
- Missals and hymnals are available in the pews.
- The holy water fonts are filled again.
- In the main section of the church, all pews are available for seating.
- In the section of pews closest to the confessionals, seating will remain every other pew for those who prefer to social distance.
- The Choir will return to their regularly scheduled 10am Mass in September.
- The distribution of Holy Communion via the chalice continues to be suspended.
- Sacrament of Reconciliation will resume in the confessionals before 5:00pm Mass on Saturdays from 3:45-4:45pm.

Two years ago, I had a memorable conversation with Msgr. Costello. He told me that a certain virus from China was going to shut down the US, and that I would not be returning to St. Peter that year as the seminarian assigned to serve the Sunday Masses. I did not believe him. He was right.

It is a joy for me to be coming back to St. Peter as your priest. I was ordained on May 29th of this year, having spent my last five years at Kenrick Seminary. I felt drawn to parish priesthood for two reasons: First, because the parish priest is a spiritual father to all those who come into his parish. Religious orders tend to have various 'specialties' in their ministry. I see parish priesthood as being closely aligned with Jesus' own life, imitating his radical availability to all those he encountered. Secondly, I love St. Louis. We live in a city with a rich history that retains its own unique character. At the same time, it is a wounded city in many ways and needs the love of Jesus Christ as it is lived out in his Church. It is these two desires that ultimately drew me to become a parish priest in the Archdiocese of St. Louis, and I am eager to begin full time ministry here at St. Peter.


I am a St. Louis native, the second of four kids, from St. Margaret Mary Alacoque Parish. In case you were wondering, I did go to a Catholic high school in St. Louis:-). After my time at SLUH, I spent four years at the University of Dallas, a small, Catholic liberal arts school, studying philosophy, and then I entered the seminary immediately after graduating.

In terms of hobbies, I enjoy playing most sports, hiking, reading the 'Great Books' (literature, philosophy, etc.), and analyzing how ideas influence culture. I am afraid of heights and brown recluses, but I fiercely maintain these are not 'irrational' fears. I like most kinds of food, and always appreciate a good meal and conversation.

I look forward to meeting you and serving as your parish priest. Jesus has given us a great commission to spread the gospel to every corner of the world. I am delighted to have been sent to this beautiful town of Kirkwood to live out this mission with you.

DAY SCHOOL NEWS

Dear St. Peter Parishioners.

It is with a spirit of deep gratitude that all of us at the day school say **thank you** for your constant prayers and support this past school year. I wish you could have seen the joy in the students and staff each day as we were able to conduct classes and fully live out our mission. I am certain that your prayers provided the grace to help us succeed.

Fifty-six of our 8th grade graduates will be attending several different Catholic and public high schools. About 85% of them go to Catholic high schools with the most going to SLUH, DeSmet, St. Joseph's Academy and Cor Jesu Academy.

We are blessed to head into next year with a strong enrollment. We will increase to approximately **540 PK4-8th grade students**. (We don't offer PK3 classes because of space constraints.) There are waiting lists in several grades. If you know a young family who intends to send their children to our school, encourage them to register in the parish right away. We base new enrollment priority on the date of registration in the parish.

Please know that we encourage the students and staff to pray the **Guardian Angel prayer** every morning just like we do during the school year. Also know that all of you are included in this prayer each day.

This coming school year we will provide regular updates and information about our school. We also welcome your input, feedback and ideas to help us faithfully fulfill God's plan for our school. Questions, concerns and prayers are welcome!




ST. VINCENT DE PAUL CORNER


