The XXXII Olympiad in Tokyo, delayed a year due to the pandemic, soon approaches. With its roots in ancient times, the modern Olympics has the power to almost deify those athletes who have reached physical perfection, proving themselves through competition to be without equal. For those of us in the stands or at home watching, we are enthralled by the discipline of these athletes and with excitement we cheer on our respective nations, knowing that a victory will be a boast not only for the individual but the flag we wave as well.

We like to think that athletic competition is about more than records and medals. When our faith in the human condition starts to fumble, there comes a story of the triumph of human goodness. Genuine sportsmanship proves itself in episodes when an athlete seeks not his or her own greatness but the elevation of humanity. One such moment happened at the 1936 Olympic Games in Berlin. Jesse Owens was watching his dream slipping away. He had fouled his first two attempts at the long jump. His blond German opponent Ludwig "Lutz" Long explained to him how he could avoid a final foul by using a simple strategy. Owens took his advice and went on to win the gold medal with a final leap of 9.06 meters. And Adolf Hitler stormed out of the stadium. Moved by the spontaneous graciousness of his closest opponent, Jesse Owens later said, "It took

a lot of courage for him to befriend me in front of Hitler. You can

melt down all the medals and cups I have and they wouldn't be a plating on the twenty-four carat friendship that I felt for Lutz Long at that moment." The aggrandizement was not for the individual self but a greater good.

When the apostle Paul was carrying out his missionary work, he preached in many Greek communities where the athleticism of mortals could put one in league with the gods. His audience, not unlike ours today, recognized that an athlete's perfection in strength, skill and stamina leads to victory in the arena. In his first letter to the church in Corinth Paul likened the Christian's need to instill discipline in the spiritual life so as to achieve the ultimate glory: "Do you not know that the runners in the stadium all run in the race, but only one wins the prize? Run so as to win. Every athlete exercises discipline in every way. They do it to win a perishable crown, but we an imperishable one. Thus I do not run aimlessly; I do not fight as if I were shadowboxing. No, I drive my body and train it, for fear that, after having preached to others, I myself should be disqualified." (9:24-27)

The Olympians gathering in Tokyo have invested many years and strained many muscles to reach this competition. They will inspire us, and remind us to direct our own energies to those pursuits in life that are noble and good. As Christians we would do well to imitate their examples of endurance and dedication to the arenas of our everyday life. When we carry out the regimen of our faith with charity and devotion we raise the spirits of humanity. St. Paul did this when he wrote his second letter to the young disciple Timothy: "*I have competed well; I have finished the race; I have kept the faith. From now on the crown of righteousness awaits me, which the Lord, the just judge, will award to me on that day, and not only to me, but to all who have longed for his appearance.*" (4:7-8)



LIVE THE LITURGY Inspiration for the week

God calls us to bring His Word to all corners of the earth. What does that mean for you and me? We are just simple and humble folks trying to find our way through the Gospel and our world. After all, we are not professional preachers but gentle servants. Jesus summons us to take his message on the road and bring it from the pew to the pavement. We cannot keep the joy of the Gospel to ourselves but must bring it into every aspect of our lives: our families, our schools, our work, our corporations, our politics, our social circles, and our philosophies. We cannot just accept the wisdom of the world as true and conduct our lives as if the Good News is a separate matter. They are one. Jesus never asked his friends to go and construct buildings where people could come to hear the truth. He asked them to go to their homes and meet them one on one, face to face. When the rubber meets the road and the message is challenging, rejection is quite possible. That's the litmus test for whether we're really doing what we have been asked.


