In my years as a priest, I've experienced a lot of nervous brides attending to countless details, hoping all goes perfectly. The pandemic vexed a lot of traditional weddings: limits were put on the number who can attend, venues became unavailable, and honeymoons got delayed because of restrictions on travel.

Jesus' first miracle took place at the wedding feast at Cana (John 2:1-12). The couple there had a crisis. Someone didn't order enough wine. I can almost hear the bride screaming, "Oh, no! My reception is ruined!" The situation was known to the Virgin



screaming, "Oh, no! My reception is ruined!" The situation was known to the Virgin Fr. Matt O'Toole Mary who brought it to the attention of her Son. Christ's changing water into wine saved the day, and Mary



was instrumental in resolving the problem.

When Pope Francis was a student in Germany in the late 1980's, he discovered a title of the Virgin popular in Bavaria: "Maria Knotenlöserin," or "Mary Un-tier of Knots." The devotion originated in the 17<sup>th</sup> century. When he was Cardinal Bergoglio of Buenos Aires, he introduced it to his native Argentina with great effect. Pope Francis has testified that later in life and amid trying times he frequently comes to Mary as the one who can assist with undoing the tangled situation he has found himself in. Here is a reflection he has given:

"Mary always brings us to Jesus. She is a woman of faith, a true believer. But we can ask: What was Mary's faith like? The first aspect of her faith is this: Mary's faith unties the knot of sin (*Lumen Gentium*, 56). What does that mean? The Fathers of the Second Vatican Council took up a phrase of Saint Irenaeus, who states that 'the knot of Eve's disobedience was untied by the obedience of Mary; what the virgin Eve bound by her unbelief, the Virgin Mary loosened by her faith' (*Adversus Haereses*, III, 22, 4).

"The 'knot' of disobedience, the 'knot' of unbelief. When children disobey their parents, we can say that a little 'knot' is created. This happens if the child acts with an awareness of what he or she is doing, especially if there is a lie involved. At that moment, they break trust with their parents. You know how frequently this happens! Then the relationship with their parents needs to be purified of this fault; the child has to ask forgiveness so that harmony and trust can be restored. Something of the same sort happens in our relationship with God. When we do not listen to him, when we do not follow his will, we do concrete things that demonstrate our lack of trust in him – for that is what sin is – and a kind of knot is created deep within us. These knots take away our peace and serenity. They are dangerous, since many knots can form a tangle which gets more and more painful and difficult to undo.

"But we know one thing: nothing is impossible for God's mercy! Even the most tangled knots are loosened by his grace. And Mary, whose 'yes' opened the door for God to undo the knot of the ancient disobedience, is the Mother who patiently and lovingly brings us to God, so that he can untangle the knots of our soul by his fatherly mercy. We all have some of these knots and we can ask in our heart of hearts: What are the knots in my life? 'Father, my knots cannot be undone!' It is a mistake to say anything of the sort! All the knots of our heart, every knot of our conscience, can be undone. Do I ask Mary to help me trust in God's mercy, to undo those knots, to change? She, as a woman of faith, will surely tell you: 'Get up, go to the Lord: he understands you.' And she leads us by the hand as a Mother, our Mother, to the embrace of our Father, the Father of mercies."

# SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

When we consider the Lord as the Good Shepherd, we see how He unites us as His flock, bringing us together under His protection. We know that He cares for each one of us more deeply than we can understand. In the parable of the lost sheep, Jesus illustrated how, when any in His flock lose their way, the entire flock must seek them out and surround them with God's grace and mercy.

In John 21:1-19, Jesus shows us that, if we entrust our efforts to evangelize the world to Him, they will always be fruitful, even when we lack understanding. As the disciples fished, unable to catch anything after hours and hours at sea despite their many years of experience, Jesus appeared and told them to simply fish from the other side of the boat. Following our Lord's direction, the catch was so large that it almost dragged their boat underwater. Jesus, teaching the apostles to be fishers of men, then gave Peter a special responsibility. Because Peter had denied Jesus three times, Jesus gave him the opportunity to express his love three times. Then, he gave Peter the instruction, "Feed my sheep."

"Peter was distressed that Jesus had said to him a third time.

"Do you love me?" and he said to him,

"Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you."

Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep.

Amen, amen, I say to you, when you were younger,

you used to dress yourself and go where you wanted;

but when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands,

and someone else will dress you and lead you where you do not want to go."

He said this signifying by what kind of death he would glorify God."

If we love Jesus, then we must in turn share His love with others. When we share God's grace and mercy with others in our community, we are blessed to experience it more deeply ourselves.

We, like Peter, are sinners, and we often underestimate our power as fishers of men. But when we serve the Lord and have faith, we can fill a community with His unending love. In Acts 5:27-32, 40b-31, as Peter stood before the Sanhedrin, the high priest told him, "You have filled Jerusalem with your teaching."


