The two sacraments of healing are especially meant to bring restoration and wholeness to body and soul: Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick. These can be especially timely when death is imminent. A good Confession is a blessed opportunity to purge our sins and hear the comforting words of absolution. Confession can be for the soul what morphine does for the body tormented by pain. I recall medals of the Virgin Mary or saints would often have stamped on the back, "I am a Catholic. Please call a priest."

This was intended for situations when a person is stricken by a life-threatening injury or unconscious. Those attending the fallen person should call not only 9-1-1 but also the spiritual doctor. Seeking out a priest for the medicinal aid of the sacraments should be one of our first thoughts on such an occasion. Do not hesitate when hospitalized or declining seriously in health to look to making a good Confession.



For a long time the Catholic Church referred to the Sacrament of the Sick as "Extreme Unction," a term meant to reinforce the notion that this would be the last blessing of your life just before you die. It was intended to be celebrated only once, ordinarily at the hour of your death. Early in my priesthood I recall coming to the hospital room of an older Catholic, and I offered to

him the Sacrament of the Sick. His eyes widened and in a panicked voice he asked, "What did the doctor tell you?"

As Pope Paul VI explained in his introduction to the ritual for this sacrament, "Extreme unction," which may also and more properly be called 'anointing of the sick,' is not a sacrament for those only who are at the point of death. Hence, as soon as any one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for that person to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived." Thus, for the celebration of this sacrament there should be the real and present danger of death, if not immediate at least approximate. This may be a reality for especially for those who are elderly or critically ill.

Integral to this ritual is the laying on of hands. When celebrating this sacrament in a hospital or nursing home or with someone in hospice care, I always invite those gathered around to join me in this gesture. Touch – from the laying on of hands and the application of the Oil of the Sick to the person's body – is a powerfully comforting experience. It fulfills what the ritual intends to accomplish: the assurance in a physical way that God is with us in our need.

When death is imminent, Viaticum – the reception of the Body and Blood of Christ – is included with Anointing of the Sick. Literally, Viaticum means "food for the journey." In Viaticum the dying person is united with Christ in his or her passage out of this world to the Father. It is ideal that reception of the Eucharist in this situation be joined by others who gather with the dying person so as to reinforce our solidarity as the Body of Christ.

God and loved ones at our side in the passage from one life to the next is a grace we may each hope to have. To make such an experience our own, we would do well to express that desire to those who will care for us and to call on the ministers of the Church for the promises provided by Christ's sacraments. Like in every Catholic parish, the priests at St. Peter Church stand ready to assist you with the sacraments in your time of need.

FATHER ARCHER'S BOOK COLUMN

The Story of a Soul by St. Therese of Lisieux



"I wonder what they will write about her when she dies, she has really never done anything important in her life." The Carmelites have a tradition of circulating a short obituary among their regional monasteries upon the death of one of their brothers or sisters. As Therese lay dying at the age of 24, her sister overheard a novice make this comment about her simple, and seemingly insignificant, life. Within 50 years, the memoirs St. Therese wrote at the command of her superior would be translated into over 50 languages, and within 150 years she would be declared a Doctor of the Church.

Why has her writing captivated millions of souls? St. Therese writes with a charming, affectionate style in a way that makes God feel close. Her childlike understanding of God as a Father whose greatest desire is to make his children know their belovedness has brought about great spiritual healing for thousands of people. Her "little way" teaches even the most accomplished that the ultimate reality of the human condition is our dependence – in childlike abandonment to God in every circumstance our true and lasting happiness is found.

St. Therese is a living testament to the truth of Jesus' words: "Unless you acquire the heart of a child, you shall not enter the kingdom of heaven" (Mt 18:3). If you desire to have such a heart and such a kingdom, open this book and learn from our youngest Doctor of the Church.

WELCOME, RCIA CANDIDATES!

Blessings of Peace and Joy as you begin your faith journey!

This weekend, we officially welcome our RCIA candidates to take the next steps on their journey towards full initiation into the Catholic Church. Through the Rite of Welcoming, two big things happen: the *first* is that each candidate formally declares their desire to be “accepted as a candidate for catechetical instruction leading to Confirmation and Eucharist”; and the second is that we as the Church affirm their desire to take this most important step on their faith journey.

So what does that mean for *you*? It means your Church family is about to get a little bit bigger! And, like any older sibling, you have some responsibilities to consider taking on:

1. **Take an active role in welcoming the candidates.** If you see the candidates — at Mass, around the parish, or even throughout Kirkwood! — say hi and introduce yourself. In fact, the Rite of Christian Initiation itself goes so far to say that the people of the parish should “welcome [the candidates] into their homes, into personal conversation, and into community gatherings” (no. 9).
2. **Consider supporting RCIA with your hospitality.** A simple way you can express your welcoming towards the candidates is to feed them! If you are an excellent baker (or a generous patron of the many local bakeries in Kirkwood!), consider signing up to provide light snacks on Sunday mornings when we gather for RCIA. 




